Parish Pastoral Council Minutes - April 22, 2021

March Minutes • Approved

Follow-up from discussions/presentations at previous meetings:

1. New Council Members introduce themselves.
2. Elect New Vice Chair (Communications, working with the parish office, running the PC elections. Steve Maurer was elected.
3. Discern for new Health (Matt Clancy) and Social Chairs (Lois Scully)
4. Becky McDonnell - Joe will be talking about our next major projects video
5. Dave - \$1792 - 360 signs sold
6. Dave - bell history with the parish. There are no St. Louis County ordinances for church bells. There are rules about how loud something can be. The county board would vote if there was a complaint registered against the bells. There was discussion and comments about the bells.

Commission Reports:

Christian Formation: Kim Blackford - Baby Shower for Birthright of Hillsboro was the biggest in years. Archdiocese is sponsoring many activities around Abortion Healing Ministry, including a day of reflection.

Christian Service: Rob Telthorst - In person mission work is still a challenge so we discussed some alternatives including how to contact our elected officials via virtual lobbying. There are some in person service missions open including helping various food pantries and the outside work.

Health: Mary Ann Schulte - Reported about the Blood Drive in May and a Healing Prayer Service in April.

Social: Becky McDonnell listed the coming events. **JUBILEE:** Memory book- we are starting to make photo pages on PowerPoint to form a digital version of the book. We are also collecting stories to include in the presentation. We will purchase light pole banners for the Jubilee. Cost to be determined. T-shirt production is on the backburner. Dick Drury is creating games and puzzles to add to the Jubilee fun. The first one, 50 pictures that have a connection to the number 50, is available in print and on the website. Three more picture puzzles are in production and will be rolled out about once a month.

Youth: Maura Clancy reported about the prayer group and upcoming service projects and weekly meetings.

Comments from Cheryl Degenhart, Director of Faith Formation reported the dates of First Communion, the end of PSR, and Confirmation. Faith Alive In the Home - facilitators may begin to visit families again. Vacation Bible School registrations are ready. FORMED membership has increased.

Comments from the Vice-Chair: Day of formation may be possible for Annual Parish Leadership Meeting.

Reflections/Updates from the chairman: Spoke with Ann about having cell phone numbers listed in the directory; time consuming issue. This might be done for the picture directory.

When can new council members be presented to the parish? More people are coming to Masses. People are not coming because certain Masses are signing up fast. Most people are not signing up early. Until social distancing mandates change, we will have to use the Parish Hall. If the trend of more people continues, we will open the parish hall in June. Additional hospitality ministers would be needed. Parking lot - Gary has been researching to get the parking lot done and will meet with someone to look at the lot to give us a different opinion. Gary will let us know more details and specifics on this meeting.

Reflections/Updates from Fr. Chuck: Linda Licata is retiring from the parish office. May 23 will be the reception for the retirees at the Reilly Center. ACA response has been strong. \$37,000 has been pledged. If you need a vaccine, please let Fr. Chuck know. He can help get appointments. The banners for the jubilee are finished and will be on the light standards, poles on the sidewalk and in trees. The banners will be there around the year.

What's the Buzz in the Parish/Neighborhood?
Neighborhood teams: when someone moves into the parish, we would be able to support and provide outreach.

As we look forward to our 50th anniversary Jubilee, I can't help but think how things have changed for us at Mass in those years. If liturgy is the "work of the people," we certainly work differently now than we did in the early days of our parish! The explosion of music by the "St. Louis Jesuits" in the 1970s helped bring vernacular musical worship to Mass. The permanent Deaconate was reinstated for the Archdiocese in 1977. The expansion of lectors and extraordinary ministers of communion to all baptized adults (previously available to only men) during the 1980's created more opportunities for laity to be involved in the liturgy. The celebration of communion under both species was first allowed here in St. Louis in the mid-1980s. The newest translation of the Mass began in 2011.

There certainly have been many changes; but one thing hasn't changed: we are still called to full, active, and conscious participation at every Mass we attend. And that's one thing Mary, Mother has done very well for the past 50 years!

Parish Pastoral Council Minutes - May 27, 2021

April Minutes - Approved

Follow-up from discussions/presentations at previous meetings: Progress Report on the Bells - Dave Baranowski: Looking at 2 companies' options. Site analysis: Suggested - the top of the church steeple and the corner of the gym. They can supply the product and install it. Nothing is approved. Still fact finding.

Commission Reports

Administration/Finance: Mary Gudinas: Major Projects - Heating and cooling for church and hall; new vestments; Carrillon System(not yet approved); parking lot resurface for 2022/2023. Roofs replacements in 2023/2024. The Budget: Operating at a deficit. Major projects fund will cover large projects for the next 5 years. Items not approved are in the budget which is normally based on the forecast of the parish income. The budget is a projected figure and list of needs of both maintenance and mission. Moving 10% of the forgiven PPP loan to tithing - approved

Christian Formation: Kim Blackford: Reported on the Mission Statement for the Peace & Justice Ministry: Nine members discussed aspects of Social Justice being important. This led to the Mission Statement. There was a discussion about the content of the Mission Statement and what parishioners believe.

Christian Service: Rob Telthorst: Plans are set for the Rock Church summer food drive. The Bridge Bread crew would like to resume in person sales after each Mass as soon as possible. Discussion of an in-person picnic with the Rock Church and service opportunities through MCU.

Liturgy: Carol Mason: Choirs will be back one time per month all summer. Over the past two weeks we have had over 100 people at the 4:30 and 9:00 Mass and close to 100 at the 11:00. We'll have the Parish Hall set up to accommodate any overflow.

Social: Becky McDonnell: July 31 50th Jubilee Mass (4:30 pm) with the Archbishop and Dinner. Becky listed other coming events through January, 2022. She presented about the merger with Assumption Athletic Association after its beginning 3 years ago. Where do we stand regarding our relationship with Assumption. 29 kids are participating in CYC sports that we know of. Families are leaving Mary Mother to Assumption due to the merger of our CYC sports.

Youth: Maura Clancy listed the future events for the youth. On July 9, 10, 11 the youth will go to the Steubenville Retreat in Springfield, MO.

Comments from Cheryl Degenhart, Director of Faith Formation: Recent parent meeting and survey about next year's PSR program. PSR will be Monday and Wednesday from 6:30-7:30; Catechists are needed for teaching. VBS registration currently open - St. Louis Review will come out to photograph our students

Here are the highlights from our June Meeting. We did not have a meeting in July.

Review of the Financials

Major Projects: Our Major Project Fund is \$30,000 over budget. These funds will eventually be used for the replacement of two RTU's (roof top units – heating and cooling), the roof, and, at a later date, resurfacing of the parking lots. Thank You to all who continue to support our Major Project Fund.

As far as repair to the annex that had water damage, this has been delayed. Some work has been done to the outside of the building that seems to have stopped the problem.

SLAF (St Louis Archdiocese Fund): The only changes to these accounts were interest postings.

Offertory Trends: Faith Direct is still up as far as contributions. With folks returning to Mass, we are seeing an increase in envelopes being used.

MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP COMMISSION

In the Parish Council Ministry re-organization, the Mary Mother Contemplative Prayer Community was shifted to the Missionary Discipleship Ministry. I have seen the words for years in the bulletin and other places in the parish; but I was not aware of what Contemplative Prayer was or more importantly, what this group does. In the words of Andy Dapron, who has been a member of this Community from its inception, contemplative prayer is prayer in which we are totally given over to God. It is an attempt to truly practice the First Commandment. This group has formed a Core Team and offers a number of opportunities to participate in this type of prayer. A few of them are listed here: Regular Centering Prayer gatherings: The Core Team currently offers two gatherings - every Monday from 2:45-4:00 pm, and on the first and third Saturdays of the month from 10:00 -11:30am. The focus of these meetings is the practice of Centering Prayer, and also includes group discussion on related topics.

St. Agatha Center – Ministers to the poor within parish boundaries, includes food pantry and education center.

Health Resource Center – Provides free healthcare access for North St. Louis community using supervised medical students from St. Louis University. Includes clinics for pediatrics, well women, healthy living, diabetes, cardiology, asthma, allergies and foot care.

St. Louis University Prison Program – An educational college program for prisoners aimed at breaking the cycle of poverty and recidivism. SLU offers an Associate's Degree program to the incarcerated, as well as prison staff, with a demonstrated reduction in repeat offenses.

Ignatian Volunteer Corp. - Matches individuals looking for meaningful service opportunities with partner sites who serve the poor and marginalized in the St. Louis community.

St. Stephen Catholic Church – Provides assistance for rural parish in Richwood, MO. The parish serves a very poor area of the state and their need is great.

Sts. Teresa & Bridget Youth Program - Supports parish youth program to pay for impoverished youth to attend a summer camp and retreat.

Blood of Christ Parish, Bolivia – Provides missionary presence in the rural area of La Paz. Sangre de Cristo is one of the many missions in Bolivia without a priest.

Carondelet Betterment Foundation Food Pantry – Supports the city neighborhood through multiple social programs and in particular, through their food pantry, serving hundreds of families each month.

Fr. Bob's Outreach Program – Provides assistance with utility bills, and also funeral/burial support for those in and around the St. Augustine Parish. Christmas baskets are provided for inner-city poor families.

Sisters of Divine Providence (Room at the Inn) – Assists their Room and the Inn shelter for homeless women and children in St. Louis.

Center for Women in Transition – Assists women as they transition from the criminal justice system back to their families and community.

Pink Ribbon Girls - Supports women with breast or other female cancers, offering meal delivery, transportation to treatment and professional housecleaning services.

English Tutoring Project – Supports the teaching of English to children from immigrant and refugee families at four Catholic elementary schools in the metro area.

Redemptorists in Thailand – Assists children who have been orphaned or abandoned by parents with AIDS. Mothers and children who have the disease are also under care.

Be looking for a pamphlet in the back of church, that will tell you all about it. Also coming soon - small groups to watch and discuss a documentary called "Growing Up Poor in America."

We have returned to some of our important practices after enduring COVID restrictions for so long. The holy water fonts have been filled; and we have returned to Processing for the Eucharist. This is very exciting! The hymnals are back in the pews; and our social distancing has been reduced. We have added 2 Eucharistic Ministers, which is all we need right now. They will wear masks and hand sanitize before distributing Communion. We will begin to utilize Servers again in August, which many are excited about. Of course, the choirs are returning; and we are using best judgement for choir practices to minimize risk of COVID transmission. The Sign of Peace is still without handshakes. For Communion, we will stand together as one (new practice) and be ushered in the traditional way pew by pew. Gratefully, we continue to livestream our Masses which is so helpful to those who are homebound. Currently the Dispensation has been lifted, so all are encouraged to attend in person if at all possible. It is about community and being in communion with one another. For any Liturgy questions, do not hesitate to ask.

SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL

Hooray!! We just found out we can go back to conducting home visits to interview our Neighbors in Need (NIN's), instead of gathering information from them by telephone because of COVID. By meeting with our NIN's face to face in their homes, we can get acquainted, verify their employment and finances, ask about any other problems they might have, and most importantly pray with them.

With two Vincentians making the visit, one can listen and take notes. The second one can provide a second set of ideas about how we can help with the Neighbor's problems. If the neighbors aren't vaccinated, we can meet at church or outdoors, wear masks, and maintain our distance while still being face-to-face.

A home visit makes our initial evaluations much easier and more meaningful, and gives our NIN two living persons to interact with instead of a voice on the phone.
