Archdiocesan Strategic Planning Process

In his August 22nd column in the St. Louis Review, Archbishop Rozanski announced that the Archdiocese is in the initial stages of a comprehensive pastoral plan that will “most likely result in the most dramatic recalibration of our Archdiocese...made in light of our ultimate goal – to enable missionary discipleship across our Archdiocese.”

The Strategic Planning Process:

- Will take at least two years and is already underway with preliminary listening sessions and questionnaires.
- Will be the main topic at the annual Archdiocesan Pastoral Assembly held on October 9th.
- Has resulted in the Archbishop putting a two year moratorium on priest transfers except for health reasons or retirement.
- Has resulted in the Archbishop putting a two year moratorium on any capital expansion or improvement projects. Parishes are allowed to spend money on repairs, maintenance or safety issues during this time.
- Target implementation date is 2026, the 200th anniversary of the Archdiocese.

More details will be communicated as the plan is developed. Remember, all are invited to the monthly Parish Council meeting held on the fourth Thursday of the month from 7 – 9 pm in the Parish Hall. Please contact Dave Baranowski prior to notify you are attending.

Parish Council Minutes June 24, 2021

May Minutes - Approved

Follow-up from discussions / presentations at previous meetings

Approve the budget - Mary & Gary: Ann added \$2400 to the budget for Cost of Food under Missionary Discipleship for 3 Welcome Gatherings. \$1,000 added for food expenses for the Mission under Social. Budget approved

Update on the Carillon Bell System - Dave: McShane Bell - \$10,500-12,000 bid. Doesn't include installation. The message to the parish - "this will not come out of the operating budget or major project fund." (See Admin/Finance report below)

Has the Peace and Justice Committee had a chance to update its Mission Statement yet? > Kim: The committee would like to keep the word intolerance in the mission statement. Were other words considered? The committee feels very strongly about keeping this word. Social justice issues will be at the forefront of the committee for education. The Mission Statement passes as is.

Progress report on updating the parish statement on racism > Fr. Chuck - Put on hold for now

Commission Reports

Admin/Finance: Mary Gudinas: First meeting with the second supplier of the Carillon system estimated at \$10,000 - \$12,000 plus the cost of installation. First group provided a cost between \$15,000 and \$18,000 for total project (Chime Masters). Suggested the bells be placed on a wish list, to differentiate from Major Projects.

Christian Formation: Kim Blackford: Status update on a possible letter to be written by Archbishop Rozanski on racism

Christian Service: Rob Telthorst: St. Vincent de Paul distributed \$2500 in Thrift Store Credits for beds, household items and clothing to families in need. This money came from accumulated credits we received from the donations made last year on the parking lot truck and also credits are accumulated from people who volunteer at the Thrift Store on behalf of MM. **Bridge Bread**, Pat Tobin is organizing a team to re-start in person bakery sales. We filled 3 trucks with food and personal care donations to the Rock Church Summer Food Drive. We also delivered \$500.00 for fresh meat.

Health: Matt Clancy: We would like to put together a topic to focus on each month. We will bring it up at Parish Council to make sure we have their permission. It would be just a 1 page flyer. July is Bone Health. **CPR/AED** training. No date yet. We will try to do something in July. **Good Samaritan Driver Ministry**. Two people used their service 3 times.

Liturgy: Carol Mason: Grand piano dedication to the Redemptorists.

Social: Lois Scully; 7/31/21 Jubilee Mass and Dinner Major Project Fund Videos are complete and ready for use

Welcoming people back might need to be a separate committee involving most commissions. Do one thing every month or so. Water will be back in the fountains.

The fall will be very busy with the Jubilee.

Possible ideas: Another round of phone calls would be appropriate - asking if they need name tags

Loved Ones wall to include the names of those who passed from Covid.

Yard signs to promote Mary Mother and invite others to Mass with a donation box instead of being charged.

(Stewardship has another sign in mind.)

A welcome back mailing might be needed as well.

Some of the upcoming changes for Mass which will be effective July 3/4 - no social distancing. Communion will be as before. Eucharistic Ministers will wear masks.

ACA Update: as of June 18, amount pledged is \$95,049 (\$90,004 is challenge goal) - 27% cards returned (300 of 1114) - 42 new donors.

Composing a letter that will offer some clarification on Major Project Fund/Capital Expenses/Ordinary Repair and Maintenance expenses. BTW: In the bulletin for the 3rd Sunday of June 2020, the Major Project Fund Revenue was \$6795.62 over budget. One year later, same week-end, the Fund Revenue is **\$34,690 over budget**. The appeal is working!!! The recent presentation of a Pastoral Letter on the Eucharist, along with a section entitled "Eucharistic coherence."

Song in the time of COVID

With apologies to Gabriel Garcia Márquez for the title, it is in our thoughts these days exactly how we are to worship in song while wearing a face covering. Often we feel muffled and sense the need to sing out more to project. Here are a few suggestions, based on what I've been gathering from voice teachers and speech pathologists regarding healthy singing (and speaking) while wearing a mask:

First, accept that the sound of the singing won't be as full and present as usual. Don't over sing loudly to try to compensate; that will just make the voice more tired. Second, breathe through your nose in a relaxed manner. The mask might feel constricting but keeping the breath slow and relaxed will help. Third, singing and speaking deliberately, with focus on pronunciation, will help intelligibility more than volume. Try to keep the sound bright and forward. And most importantly, remember that mask or not, God hears and loves our prayers and songs!

Here are the highlights from the August meeting.

The Fiscal Year of 20/21 closed on June 30. All things considered, we ended the year with only a \$2000 loss.

Major Projects:

The two new HVAC units (for the church and Parish Hall) were scheduled to be installed September 8 and 9. They will be energy efficient, thus saving us money on utilities.

There was a change to the Major Project list. The Carillion system was removed from capital expenses since no Major Project money would be used to purchase it. It now has its own Line Entry on the Major Project List.

Offertory Trends:

There has been a shift in donors of RMD's (Required Minimum Distribution) from monthly to quarterly. Income from Sunday envelopes, Sunday Loose, and Holy Days were all down for Fiscal Year 20/21. Faith Direct made up the deficit. The category of Gifts and Stock/RMD added substantially to 20/21. .

Starting in October, we will return to the traditional Offertory. A new practice will be implemented. Instead of the Hospitality Ministers passing the pole baskets for the collection of Offertory, we will pass individual baskets from parishioner to parishioner. This promotes community, allows contributions, and provides the opportunity to offer prayer by holding your hand over the basket momentarily. For those who tithe electronically, cards will once again be provided in the pews. When the basket is passed, simply place a laminated card in the basket, indicating that you give electronically (totally optional to do). The Gifts will be brought forward (opportunity for families and others). And adding to the appearance of “return to normalcy” post-pandemic, we are reimplementing Mass Monitors to facilitate the goings-on of the liturgical tasks during Mass. This includes coordinating the Eucharistic Ministers, the Gift Bearers and the Hospitality Ministers.

Also in October, along with other special liturgies, the Anointing of the Sick will take place at all Masses on October 23rd and 24th on the third weekend in October.
