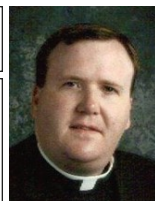

doctors, and when I am able it will be replaced. So I don't have a date, and frankly don't want to talk about it, and I will update you as things develop. Again, thank you!

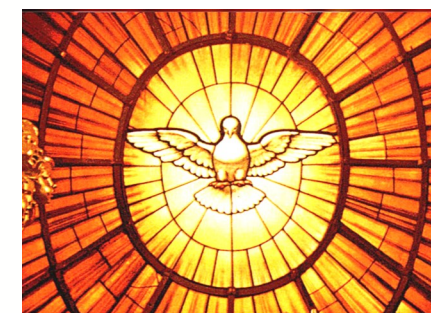
THE LAY DOMINICANS
