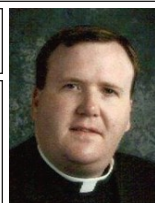

THE PASTOR'S PEN

Dear Parish Family,

What are we supposed to do when disagreements arise inside the Church?

That same question was faced by the community of Christians in Antioch, in first-century Palestine, as St Luke describes it in the Book of Acts. Antioch, unlike Jerusalem, was a cosmopolitan city, because it was on the trade route that connected Asia Minor with the port cities of Palestine. A large community of Jews was based there, along with just as many Gentiles (Greeks and Romans). When the gospel was first preached there, it won converts from all three groups, Jews, Greeks, and Romans.

As the community grew, a disagreement cropped up. Some of the Jewish converts were saying that the Gentiles who became Christians should follow the Mosaic Law - the law of the Old Testament about circumcision and dietary practices. But others said that since Christ had fulfilled those laws in himself, it was no longer necessary to follow them. The disagreement got heated. It was threatening to divide the community.

Had the Holy Spirit made a mistake? Was he on vacation, failing to inspire the Church?

No. God had known that disagreements would arise among Christians, and he had instituted a hierarchical structure through which the Holy Spirit would resolve them. The Christians in Antioch sent a delegation to Jerusalem,

where Peter and the other Apostles were still living. Peter called the Apostles together in a council about how to deal with the disagreement, and it was decided that Gentile Christians didn't have to follow the Law of Moses. Today's reading from the Book of Acts shows us this whole process unfolding.

It tells us that disagreements are natural and unavoidable, and that through its hierarchical structure, the Church has been well-equipped by God to resolve them. Sometimes the clerical hierarchy fails; we can see this in the way misconduct has been handled. Sometimes, no matter what a priest says or does, it will make some unhappy. As St. Teresa of Calcutta would say, "love them anyway."

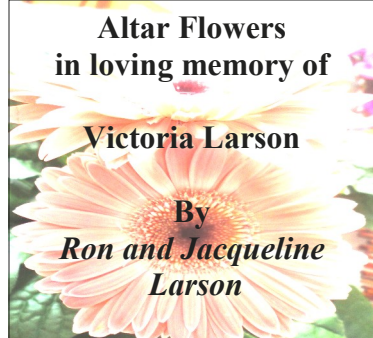
