**TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

In today's Gospel, we hear of the ten men afflicted with leprosy, and the one who glorifies God for being healed. It is a dramatic scene of gratitude. But in order for the miracle to happen in the first place, these men had to start walking in faith before their diseased conditions change one tiny bit. Good stewards of their faith realize that they cannot wait until their problems are over to start walking in faith. They praise God even in the darkest of nights, and in the worst of circumstances. Do we walk in faith, offering the Lord our gratitude even when we are in difficult circumstances?

**BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE**

On the back counters of the church and on the altar rails near the side doors you will find the "Book of Remembrance" sheets where you may inscribe the names of your departed loved ones.

**The Book of Remembrance will be placed on the altar of the Blessed Virgin Mary during the month of November.**

The month of November is the traditional month in our Church Year to remember the faithful departed, and the Book of Remembrance is a reminder to us of the importance of our prayers for them.

Placing the book at Mary's altar also invokes her powerful intercession with her Son, the Lord and Giver of Life.

**Healing After Reproductive Loss**

The archdiocese is hosting a presentation to help others provide support and healing for those who have experienced reproductive loss (miscarriage, abortion). The presentation will be led by Life Perspectives. They have been providing resources to leaders and professionals for over a decade in this area.

**PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK**

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick offers prayer for healing, hope, and strength and is intended for a Catholic at the beginning of a serious illness, before surgery or weakened due to age or chronic infirmity. Viaticum, "Food for the Journey", is Holy Communion with special prayers for the dying and serves as the "last rites" for Catholics who are terminally ill and in the last stages of life.

Our parish clergy are always willing to visit hospitals to pray with and support those who are ill. Sacraments in the hospital are provided by the designated Catholic Chaplain. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion generously make themselves available to bring Holy Communion to the home-bound of our parish. Please contact the Parish Office to arrange for any of these services.

**SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE**

In accordance with Archdiocesan Policy, couples contemplating marriage are to begin their preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least six months before their anticipated wedding date. Call the Parish Office or visit our website for more information.
