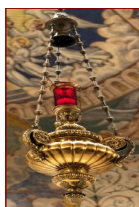

THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In today's second reading we hear Saint Paul urging the members of the community at Thessalonica to direct their hearts to God's love through Christ. He wants them to be laser-focused on Christ, and nothing else. He desires that they be strengthened by the Lord and shielded from what is not Christ-like. Good stewards cultivate a "laser-sharp" focus on Christ; not on things that could give them false or superficial images or ideals. Let's think about our own daily focus: Do we direct our hearts toward Christ or are there other "gods" that claim our attention? Our career? Material possessions? Sexuality? Favorite sports team? Political leanings? Does our daily life point to Christ so that those who are younger and less mature in their faith learn from our example?

CAMPAIGN FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT

This is the bishops' second collection which addresses the root causes of poverty. As the bishops' say on their website: "A hand up, not a hand out!" We collected over \$160,000 in last year's collection, and in turn received \$280,000 in national grants to organizations in the archdiocese in 2019. The archdiocese retains 25% of the collection which is used in part for the Cornerstone Builders program at Catholic Charities, which is a comprehensive approach to addressing the needs of incarcerated and formerly incarcerated people. Over \$6000 was also allocated to the following local recipients: The Jesuit Social Research Institute, ATD Fourth World Movement, Fund 17, St. Martha Parish, VEGGI Farmers Cooperative, the Ignatian Volunteer Corps, the Concerned Citizens of St. John's, and the choir at St. Mary's Academy.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick offers prayer for healing, hope, and strength and is intended for a Catholic at the beginning of a serious illness, before surgery or weakened due to age or chronic infirmity. Viaticum, "Food for the Journey", is Holy Communion with special prayers for the dying and serves as the "last rites" for Catholics who are terminally ill and in the last stages of life. Our parish clergy are always willing to visit hospitals to pray with and support those who are ill. Sacraments in the hospital are provided by the designated Catholic Chaplain. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion generously make themselves available to bring Holy Communion to the home-bound of our parish. Please contact the Parish Office to arrange for any of these services.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

In accordance with Archdiocesan Policy, couples contemplating marriage are to begin their preparation for the Sacrament of Marriage at least six months before their anticipated wedding date. Call the Parish Office or visit our website for more information.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents and godparents of children to be baptized are required to participate in Baptismal preparation sessions. This can be done even before the birth of the child. Baptisms, after 11:00am Mass, are scheduled with the Parish Office.
