PARISH LITURGY SCHEDULE

Effective May 16, 2020

Our parish will resume its normal Mass schedule on Saturday, May 16th with a maximum occupancy of 100 people in church.

Masses will be offered at the following times each week:

- Saturdays - 4pm Holy Mass
- Sundays - 9am, 11am, and 6pm Holy Masses
- Monday-Friday - 7am Holy Mass

Please understand that **there is still no obligation to attend Mass on Sundays or Holy Days**; and, for many of you, the most prudent decision remains to avoid coming to church or any other public gatherings, especially for those who are sick, who are caring for someone who is sick, or who are at particular danger if they should contract COVID-19.

If you are unsure whether you should come to Mass, please follow the directions of your doctor.

For the present time, we will continue to live-stream Mass everyday so that those who are unable to be physically present may still participate.

The live-streamed Masses will be the 4pm Saturday Mass, the 9am Sunday Mass, and the 7am Weekday Masses.

Parishioners will no longer need to sign up in advance to attend Mass.

Instead, we will have volunteers present at Mass to make sure that the number of 100 is not exceeded. The signal that the church has not yet reached the capacity of 100 people is that the doors of church will be propped open. **If we reach the 100 person limit for a particular Mass, the doors will be closed and no more people will be permitted to enter.** (I encourage parishioners to consider attending Mass during the week instead of on the weekend when possible, since the weekday Masses will likely be less crowded than the weekend.)

When coming to church, please observe the following temporary policies:

- According to the order of the mayor, **anyone entering the church must keep their face covered at all times**, except for the immediate time of receiving Holy Communion. Anyone not wearing a mask will be asked to leave the church. **Wearing a mask helps protect those around you**, in case you have unknowingly been exposed to Coronavirus. If you are in need of a mask, please contact the church office during business hours; we may be able to help you get one.
- **Social distancing of at least six feet must be maintained** between any people who do not live in the same household. (I encourage you to remind anyone who may forget and come too close to you.)
- **Please use hand sanitizer when you enter church and when you leave.** Hand sanitizer will be provided at the entrances to church.
- **We ask that parishioners avoid any unnecessary touching of surfaces.**
- **The church will be sanitized after every Mass.** Any volunteers who can remain after each Mass to help would be greatly appreciated.
- Collections will not be taken up during Mass, but baskets will be available on the altar rail at the front of the church and on the credenzas at the back of church for parishioners to drop off envelopes and donations.

The way of offering the sacrament of reconciliation will remain as it has been. **Confessions will be available outdoors in the parking lot on the Cabrini side of the church on Tuesday-Saturday evenings from 6:00 until 6:30pm.** (In case of rain, confessions will be cancelled for that day.)
