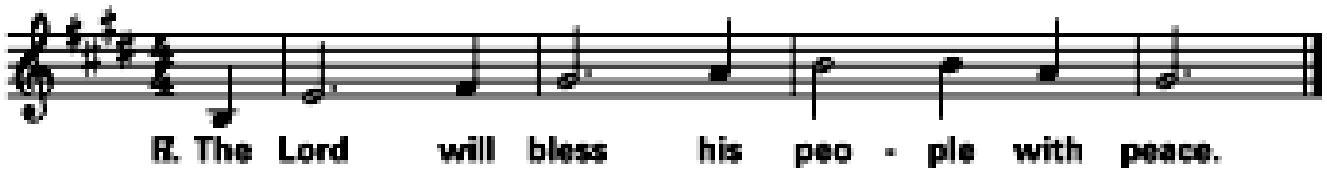

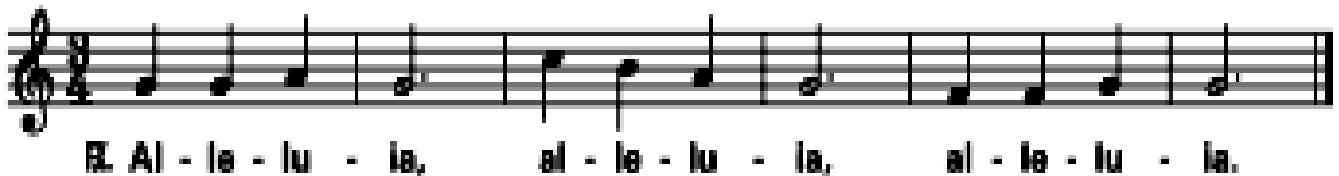


SECOND READING
