EARLY TRAINING "Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it." Proverbs 22-6

When we construct a plan for introducing our children to Jesus, we may want to make our motto "the earlier the better." In a recent nationwide poll, researcher George Barna learned that children ages 5 through 13 have a 32 percent probability of accepting Christ as their Saviour. Spiritual training of children should ideally begin at their earliest moments of awareness and continue through the teen years. A most important year, may be around age 5 - when they're open and tender to the call of Christ. That's when they begin to internalize what they are taught to make it their own. Without guidance, Bible stories can become as fables that don't seem to apply to the real world. During this period, our careful instruction can lay a strong faith foundation that will guide our children throughout their earthly lives - and lead them into a joyous eternity. The Saints have shown us in amazing ways—that it's never too late to lead youth to the Lord! Hope lives and turns things around! As we grow closer the Lord, His love and power of the Holy Spirit living in us, can guide youth HUNGERING for JESUS. Lived-out faith is contagious!

BEFORE YOU SAY GOODNIGHT... Dear Jesus, You are the master teacher. Help us follow Your example as we train our children—to say the right words at a time when their ears will hear, so that they will become devoted followers of You. 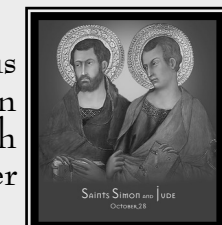
