

My Dearest Parishioners in Jesus Christ,
 The Universal Church celebrates the feast of St. Simon and St. Jude on Sunday, October 28. Both these Saints were Lord's great and holy Apostles, two of the twelve, appointed and chosen by Jesus Himself from among us, to be His Servants to help in the ministry and works of salvation through Jesus. Both of them went through many trials and difficulties, acceptance and rejection by the people and communities to whom they were sent. Yet they persevered on, and like St. Paul the Apostle, they never gave up in the face of difficulties and through their good and hard work, they gained many souls to the mercy of God, and brought them towards salvation. Indeed, these two, among the other ten Apostles, were the crucial and important pillars of the Faith and Salvation.
 We are privileged to have St. Simon and St. Jude as the Patron Saints of our Parish, the only Parish in the entire Diocese to be named after these great Saints. In preparation for the feast of St. Simon and St. Jude, we will be praying the Novena, starting from Saturday, October 20 and ending on Sunday, October 28. The Novena will be prayed after the Mass and I am requesting you my dear Sisters and Brothers to make yourselves available to attend the Novena and pray for your specific intentions through the intercession of these Saints.

Also please know that we pray the devotion to St. Simon and St. Jude every Wednesday after the Mass in our Church, and I have had people share with me a few miraculous things that have happened in their lives, after praying the devotion to these Saints, for nine weeks in a row. Miracles still happen today and we only need to be open to the invitation of God and the promptings of the Holy Spirit. And here is an invitation from God, if we'd like a miracle to happen in our individual life or in the lives of our family. When you go to the Novena, you could either pray for a specific intention all nine days or pray for a different intention every day. Maybe this is the opportune time in our life for God to intervene and let us not turn our back to this loving invitation from God to grow in our devotion to these great Saints and for the opportunity for a miracle.
