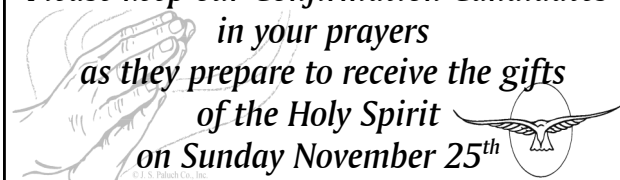

**FROM OUR PASTOR, FR. ANTONY**

My Dearest Parishioners in Jesus Christ,

Jesus plainly tells the disciples, "You know, among the pagans, their so-called rulers lord it over them and their great men make their authority felt. This is not to happen among you." That is the way of the world. And Jesus' way is diametrically opposite to it. For Jesus, anyone who wants to be great must be a servant; anyone who wants to be first must be a slave to all.

Disciples of Jesus, are we listening to Him? Or are we bent upon following the sinful and exploitative way of the world? Don't we find among us unapproachable Pastors, authoritarian Principals, and power-hungry Superiors? Don't we indulge in shameless scheming to capture power, the first seats wherever they are available — no matter at what price — spiritually and ethically? Are we following Jesus, the poor or Lucifer, the proud?

In a survey in Spain, where Catholic practices have registered an all-time low of 10% among the youth, the main reason for their disaffection with the church is the power it wields. The youth instinctively feel the Church has gone away from the path of Jesus. And they don't want to have anything more to do with such a Church.

The noise of everyday living dominates the existence of one who relies on himself and has made riches a home in his very being. But poverty remains serene. It can stop to consider a fellow creature's need. The tender hands of poverty bear the weight of the world. Only poverty can bring comfort. All that seek to possess are destructive. The more a man seeks to take hold of the outer regions of his existence, the faster things slip from his eager grasp. Only the poor can truly "possess" life in detachment, in disinterestedness. St. Francis of Assisi lived in this way. There was about him, something spontaneous, modest, reserved and chaste, something that would not force itself upon anyone or anything. His poverty was a gazing into the eyes of God. Thus he could make all creatures his friends — sister sun, brother fire, brother death and brother man.

As we continue our meditation on the readings today, let us pray: *Lord, day by day, may I become smaller and smaller and possess less and less, Amen.*

Let us pause for a while and ask ourselves: **What is my mission and vision in life: to possess more or to serve more? What makes me genuinely happy: my many possessions or my renunciations?**

- When the little boy finished reading this, there were some great big ol' tears in his eyes. He looked straight up at her and said "Mom, I sure do love you!" then took the pen and in big letters wrote: **"PAID IN FULL"**

Jesus is like that. He never counted the cost to us, for REAL AGAPE LOVE. He still lives in, and loves us, through those who care, or have cared so much for us at NO CHARGE.
