FROM OUR PASTOR, FR. ANTONY

My Dearest Parishioners in Jesus Christ,

Greetings to all my Sisters and Brothers. I received the following two messages a couple of days ago and I thought it would be worth sharing.

RICE Vs. SALT

If you were to cook 3 cups of rice, would you add 3 cups of salt to it? Certainly not. So in every preparation of rice, the rice always outnumbers the salt, yet, a little salt makes a huge difference/impact in the overall outcome.

In the room you are currently in, look up at the ceiling.....what is the size of the bulb, compared to the size of the room? It is probably a ratio of 1: 5000. Yet darkness flees the entire space once the small bulb is flipped on. If I am the salt of the earth, and the light of the world, then "little me" has the ability to make "BIG" things happen.

Sometimes, because we feel outnumbered or overwhelmed at the sheer magnitude of evil or wrong-doers, we then choose powerlessness, and decide to go with the flow, not standing up for what we believe is right.

The Mass has two clearly distinctive sections. The *Liturgy of the Word* and the *Liturgy of the Eucharist*. The *Liturgy of the Word* concludes with the Prayers of the Faithful. The Prayers of the Faithful are also referred to as Universal Prayers, Bidding Prayers, Prayers of Petition, General Intercessions or Intercessory Prayers. These prayers are to include:

- the needs of the universal church;
- public authorities and the salvation of the world;
- those oppressed by any need;
- the local community.

The exact wording of our Prayer of the Faithful is not specified; each community uniquely prepares and provides their petitions. Over the years many Prayers of the Faithful have really touched my heart. I would like to share a few of them you.

- *For forgiveness as we remember times when we have attacked others with rage and anger.*
- *For the openness to acknowledge mysteries that are beyond our physical comprehension.*
- *For the strength to live a simpler life in the face of abundant material goods.*
- *Bless all who lighten our burden by their thoughtfulness, humour, and creativity.*
- *May scientific research deepen our thirst for the wisdom and knowledge of God.*
- *Too often our faith exists only in our minds and words; awaken us to new and practical ways to en flesh our commitment to your will.*
- *Free us from our need to control, and give us the grace to free others from our expectations.*
- *Give us the patience to live with our own shortcomings and those of others.*
- *For those who believe they do not know how to pray.*
- *For those burdened by responsibilities they did not seek for themselves.*
- *For community leaders, that they seek safety for the homeless and all who depend on the kindness of strangers.*
- *For those who use social media devices to avoid personal contact with others, knowingly or subconsciously.*

As baptized Christians, we are able to pray to God our Father, because in baptism we have become the Father's sons and daughters. We turn to our Father in the Prayer of the Faithful, the special prayer of baptized Christians. During this prayer we open our hearts to the whole world. May we always remember to pray for the needs of others and ourselves too!
