FROM OUR PASTOR, FR. ANTONY

My Dearest Parishioners in Jesus Christ,

A sick Priest was always extremely patient. One day, a physician had to perform a painful operation on him and, not hearing the sick Priest complain at all, asked where he got the strength and patience to bear such pain. The reply was; "Doctor, two of us are sharing the suffering. Today God has come down to me in Holy Communion and I am sharing my suffering with Him."

The Universal Church today celebrates the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. The Holy Eucharist promotes the Spirit of religion which is a bond and exchange with God. Through the Holy Mass a worthy sacrifice is offered to God in adoration, thanksgiving, satisfaction and supplication. The Eucharistic worship is the centre of our religion. The Eucharist strengthens our faith. It is in fact the celebration of the mystery of faith. Intimately connected with the Eucharist's mystery are the mysteries of Incarnation, Redemption and Holy Trinity. It is therefore an intensive and continuous exercise of faith.

The Eucharist is also the sacrament of hope. It is for us a 'pledge of future glory'. It is a fountain of water that reaches up to eternal life. Our union with the Eucharistic Jesus prepares us for our union with Him in paradise.

Life belongs to God. It is God's concern to maintain life. Any wonder then if God's Son, who came that we may have life in abundance, who called Himself life and bread of life, willed to remain with us as bread of life? That is the Eucharist; God's concern for man's well-being in the most plain, concrete, down-to-earth language—bread.

Jesus is given to the world. He was chosen, blessed and broken to be given. Jesus' life and death are life for others. The beloved Son of God, chosen from all eternity, was broken on the cross so that this one life could multiply and become bread for people of all places and times. As God's beloved children, we have to believe that our little lives, when lived as God's chosen and blessed children, are broken to be given to others. We too have to become bread for the world.

Whenever we come together around the table, take bread, bless it, break it, and give it to one another, saying: "The Body of Christ", we know that Jesus is among us. He is among us not as a vague memory of a person who lived long ago but as a real life-giving presence that transforms us.

On this occasion of the feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus, let us pray together: **Break me, Lord, and use me to build up Your Kingdom.**

FROM DEACON DON

OUR GOD IS AN AWESOME GOD

Moses and the people were in the desert, but what was he going to do with them? They had to be fed, and feeding two or three million people requires a lot of food. According to the Quartermaster General in the Army, it is reported that Moses would have to have had 1,500 tons of food each day. Do you know that to bring that much food each day, two freight trains, each at least a mile long, would be required.

Besides, you must remember they were out in the desert, so they would have to have firewood to use in cooking the food. This would take 400 tons of wood and a few more freight trains, each a mile long, just for one day.

And just think, they were forty years in transit. And, Oh Yes! They would have to have water. If they only had enough to drink and wash a few dishes, it would take 11,000,000 gallons each day and a freight train with tank cars, 1,800 miles long, just to bring water.

And then another thing! They had to get across the Red Sea at night. So there had to be a space in the Red Sea, three miles wide so that they could walk 5,000 abreast to get over in one night.

And then, there is another problem . . . each time they camped at the end of the day, a campground two-thirds the size of the state of Rhode Island was required, or a total of 750 square miles long . . . think of it! This much space for camping.

Do you think Moses figured all this out before he left Egypt? I think not! You see, Moses believed in God. God took care of these things for him. Now do you think God has any problem taking care of all your needs? I asked the Lord to bless you as I prayed for you today. To guide you and protect you as you go along your way . . . His love is always with you, His promises are true, and when we give Him all our cares, you know He will see us through.

Our God is an Awesome God!!

So, when the road you are traveling on seems difficult at best, just remember I am praying and God will do the rest.
