FROM OUR PASTOR, FR. ANTONY
My Dearest Parishioners in Jesus Christ,
In the Gospel we see Jesus determined to go to Jerusalem where He knows His death is sure. On His way to Jerusalem three would-be disciples approach Jesus expressing their willingness to follow Him. To the first Jesus says: "Foxes have holes but....", to the second: "Let the dead bury their dead." To the third, He says: "No one who puts his hand to the plough and turns back is fit for the Kingdom." All these manifest their readiness to follow Jesus. But they also reveal what makes one really ready or not ready. And that is freedom. The three persons were not free and they cited their attachments as excuses.
This inner freedom is the theme of today's second reading. Such freedom is needed not only to become a priest or religious. The journey to Jerusalem is not just geographical—the journey is in our mind and in the daily decisions we have to make. For example, for a student the decision to be honest in the examination hall, for a businessman to be honest in business, for an officer to be honest enough not to take a bribe. To abort or to save a life. In all such and similar situations, to make the correct decisions that will make us friends of Jesus needs inner freedom. In all these cases we must ask a simple question: Will my decision and the subsequent actions take me closer to Jesus or not?

Why do I find it so hard to forgive? Why am I addicted to drinks and drugs? All these are because I am attached to something or someone other than Christ. To follow Christ is to be supremely free. Following Christ I will become my best self, free from all attachments and addictions.

Listen to this saying from an Anglican Bishop; When I was young and free, I dreamed of changing the world. In maturity I discovered that the world would not change, so I decided to change my country. After some effort I ended up understanding that this too was impossible. At the end of my years, I tried to change my family but they went on being the same as they were before.

Now on my death bed I discovered that my mission was to change myself. If I had done that I would have been able to change my family. Then, with a little luck that change would affect my country, and then who knows I might have even changed the whole world.

When we accept the lordship of Jesus over us, the Ten Commandments are not a burden but a protection and safeguard. We are either free in Jesus or slaves to Satan. The choice is ours. In the final analysis, all the rest are mere rationalizations, empty excuses, masks. The more readily and more often we indulge in them, the farther we are from the truth, and the less free. Just ask ourselves while praying over these readings: Do I really want to be free? Am I at home with truth, the naked truth of my life and being?
