

FROM OUR PASTOR, FR. ANTONY

My Dearest Parishioners in Jesus Christ.

This is what God reminds us of and commands us in today's readings. "Be holy. For I, the Lord your God, am holy" (First Reading), "Surely you know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit lives in you....God's temple is holy, and you vourselves are His temple" (Second Reading). "You must therefore be perfect just as your Heavenly Father is perfect" (Gospel).

There are many people who feel, "This holiness talk is for Priests and Religious. I am just an average Christian, struggling to make both ends meet." We feel at home with the lifestyle of the rich and the famous. Holiness is a topic that numbs our mind and blurs our vision. It leaves us more frustrated than inspired. And we wonder, "How can we become holy"?

There is a beautiful story about Mahatma Gandhi. A mother brought her child to Gandhi with the hope that he would curb the child's love for the sweets. He did not do anything but told them to return after a week. When they returned, the mother asked Gandhi, why they had to wait for a week. He said, "Until one week ago, I too was very fond of sweets." He could not preach self-control if he himself lacked self-discipline. These wise words of Gandhi offer us the way to holiness. Jesus first began to do and then preach. Holiness requires effort. There is no short cut to it. There are no substitutes for prayer, fasting and self-discipline.

Holiness is an inside job. St. Paul writes to the Corinthians: "Are you not aware that you are the temple of God?" Holiness is not something like a hat we put on our head. It is living the life of the One who fashioned us. We have to be cautious about god men and god women who offer salvation like instant coffee, without taking any trouble. God is the standard of Christian conduct and the apex Christian holiness. In the pursuit of moral perfection, a Christian should not ask: "How much further can I go without committing mortal sin?" Rather, his concern must be; "How much do I resemble my Heavenly Father?" God creates out of nothing. Wonderful; we say. Yes, to be sure, but He does what is still more wonderful, He makes Saints out of sinners.

To follow up on what I wrote last weekend; The Shrove Tuesday Dinner is this Tuesday (February 25) in the Parish Hall, between 5:00 pm and 7:00 pm. Please don't feel like you have to stay for the entire time. You are more than welcome to stay as long as you would like and socialize.
