


Thanksgiving Prayer



Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Mary's of the Lake:

This Sunday (Nov 22) we celebrate the **SOLEMNITY OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST THE KING OF THE UNIVERSE**, which marks an end of a church year. Next SUN will be our First SUN of Advent & a beginning of a new liturgical year.

◆ The Scripture Readings for Mass for the Feast of Christ the King this year (Year A) offer us 3 special images of Christ the King: **A Shepherd, the Risen Lord, and the Judge** of all nations. In the **FIRST READING** from Ezekiel, the prophet pictures **God as a shepherd**. God was indeed disappointed with the regular shepherds of His people –i.e. the kings & religious leaders. They led people away from God and to eventual disaster when the Babylonians invaded. God promised that He himself would shepherd His people rightly. This promise was perfectly fulfilled in Jesus. The **SECOND READING** is from First Corinthians –from a chapter on the topic of




the Resurrection. St. Paul tells us **the Risen Lord** will reign 'until He has put all His enemies under His feet,' when He 'hands over the kingdom to His God and Father.' The **GOSPEL** is the scene of The Final Judgment, when Jesus is portrayed as **the Judge & King sitting upon his glorious throne,**

and 'all the nations will be assembled before Him;' And 'He will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on His right and the goats on His left.' *The criterion for His judging* is focused on the Love, Care, Concern, and Service that people have for one another: 'For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me.' And Jesus the King confirms that: '... whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me.' On the other hand, toward those who did not reach out with love, care, concern and service to those who are hungry & thirsty, a stranger & naked, ill or in prison, Jesus also confirms: 'Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me.'

◆ The **FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING** reminds us to **rededicate our life to Jesus Christ the King of the Universe, and the King of our lives.** May Christ the King bless us as we rediscover Him in order to know Him more, to love Him more, and to serve Him more in one another in this world –looking forward to be happy with Him forever in heaven. **LONG LIVE JESUS THE KING!** Fr.
