

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Mary's of the Lake:

ASH WEDNESDAY February 17, 2021
-WHAT'S DIFFERENT THIS YEAR?

♦ As we approach the Season of Lent we enter this Season with the distribution of ashes on Ash Wednesday. Though this is not a Holy Day of Obligation, it is commonly a well-attended Mass and an ancient tradition where we all join together as a community to be reminded – as one of the invocations for the imposition of ashes states – that ‘Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.’ This Ash Wednesday, like much this year, will look a bit different. We want to take the time to inform you of some of the changes as well as give you a little history and



understanding of the changes that will occur...

♦ Because we would like to reduce the opportunity for potential contamination, the distribution of ashes will be done by sprinkling ashes on the top of the head rather than distributed in the accustomed way. This is a more ancient form of the distribution of ashes that continues in the Church today in much of Italy and provides for a decreased opportunity to spread COVID 19. As Rome instructs,

the Rite of distribution of Ashes will be done in the following way:

NOTE ON ASH WEDNESDAY

Distribution of Ashes in Time of Pandemic

The Priest says the prayer for blessing the ashes. He sprinkles the ashes with holy water, without saying anything. Then he addresses all those present and only once says the formula as it appears in the Roman Missal, applying it to all in general: ‘Repent, and believe in the Gospel’, or ‘Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return’. The Priest then cleanses his hands, puts on a face mask and distributes the ashes to those who come to him or, if appropriate, he goes to those who are standing in their places. The Priest takes the ashes and sprinkles them on the head of each one without saying anything.
