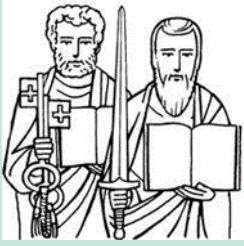
dropped off at church by 4:00 p.m. on August 6th. This is a project all can take part in. Thank you!

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Mary's of the Lake:



Every year on June 29 the Church celebrates the solemnity of **Ss. Peter & Paul**. Below are some highlights on these 2 great Apostles. As we honor them, we ask them to pray for us & for the Church.

♦ **ST. PETER** was called by Jesus from a fishing boat & became one of the Twelve. The New Testament clearly shows Peter as the leader of the Apostles. With James & John he was privileged to witness the Transfiguration, the raising of a dead child to life and the agony in Gethsemane. Peter's mother-in-law was cured by Jesus. He was sent with John to prepare for the last Passover before Jesus' death. Also, St. Peter was known as denying Jesus 3 times. After the Resurrection, Our Lord asked Peter 3 times: **'Simon, son of John, Do you love me?'** All the 3 times Peter said YES as if to make up for the 3 times he denied Jesus. Also, in the Scriptures St. Peter's name is first on every list of Apostles. He also often took a leadership role and often was a speaker for the group. Determined to spread the faith, St. Peter finally traveled to Rome, where he became the first Bishop of Rome –and also considered as the first Pope. Tradition has it that when Peter was led to be crucified in Rome around the year 67, he asked to be crucified **upside down** because he said that he did not deserve to die the same way that Jesus died. St. Peter is often depicted with the Keys in his hands, based on what Jesus said to St. Peter: **'You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church! I will give you the key to the kingdom of Heaven.'** (cf. *Matt 13:19*)

♦ **ST. PAUL** was born with the name Saul. He was raised and schooled as a legalistic Pharisee, and opposed to the New Way –the Way of Jesus! Saul had been on a mission to expose, to arrest and to put in prison Christians whom he regarded as a dangerous breakaway sect of Judaism. One day, while on the road to Damascus, he was struck down and heard the voice of Jesus. The grace of God did convert him. His Conversion was seen as 100 per cent –**from opposing Jesus and His way to fervently believing and promoting the Way of Jesus!** His name was changed from Saul to Paul. His missionary journeys finally brought him to Rome, where he was imprisoned twice and was **beheaded around the year 67**. St. Paul has been known as *Apostle to the Gentiles* & has often been depicted with a sword in his hands. The sword here is understood as a **two edged sword**, which stands for the WOG, as we can read from Hebrew 4: 12, *'The Word of God is living and effective, sharper than any two-edged sword, penetrating even between soul and spirit, joints and marrow, and able to discern reflections and thoughts of the heart'*. In the NT there are 14 Letters that bear St. Paul's Name.

MinisTree Program

We can start again! Through Catholic United Financial the MinisTREE program is designed to identify and meet some of the volunteer needs in our parish. By participating in this program, you are helping to meet our parish needs while also supporting our religious education program. For every 25 "leaves" that are completed or turned in, Catholic United Financial will contribute \$125, up to a maximum of \$500 in a calendar year. "Leaves" can be filled out for some of the following activities: cleaning the sacristy, watering flowers, bringing in food pantry items, sewing supplies, food for a funeral or helping at a funeral meal. Any Parish activities you volunteer at can be reported. Some of the cards are already printed with an activity such as "food pantry donation" or "cleaning" printed on them. Other cards are blank and things like "worked at funeral" or "food for funeral", etc. can be written on them. "Leaves" (activity cards) will be available on the bulletin board in the back corner of the church. When you have completed an activity fill out one of the cards and put it in the manilla envelope marked Completed MinisTree Cards.
