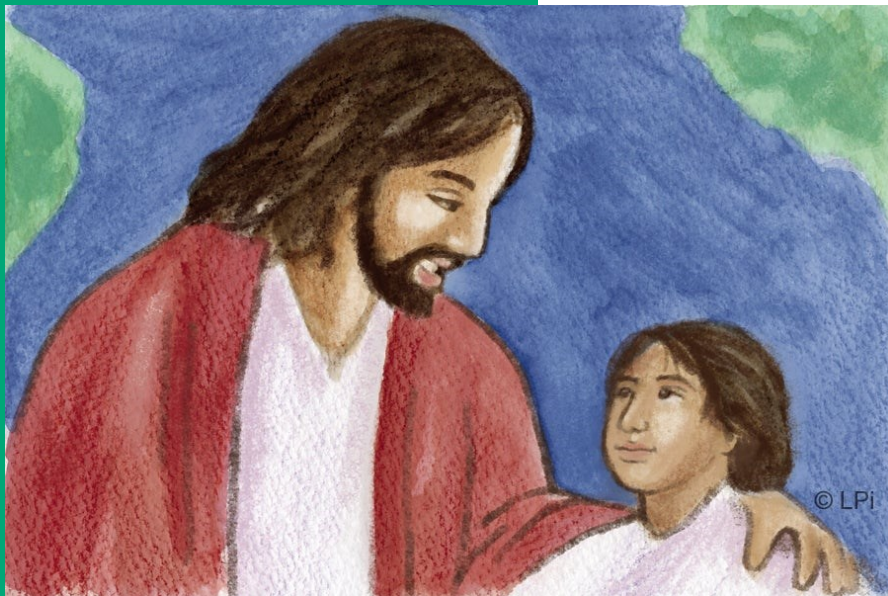

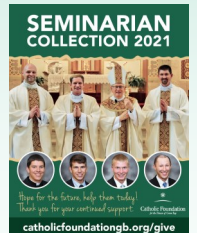


There are roped pews for those with masks and social distancing. Please ask the ushers for assistance.

## Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Mary's of the Lake:

[Below is part of Pope Francis' Angelus message at the Heroes' Square in Budapest SUN Sept 12, 2021]:

✠ The word 'Eucharist' means 'thanksgiving', and at the end of this celebration that concludes the Eucharistic Congress



and my visit to Budapest, I want to thank you from my heart. I thank the great Hungarian Christian family, which I would like to embrace in its rites, its history, its brothers and sisters, both Catholic and those of other confessions: all journeying towards full

unity. I cordially greet my Brother, Patriarch Bartholomew, who honors us with his presence. I particularly thank my beloved brother Bishops, the priests, the men and women religious and all of you, dear faithful! I greatly thank those who worked so hard for the Eucharistic Congress and today's celebration.

◆ In renewing my gratitude to the civil and religious authorities who welcomed me, I want to say *köszönöm* [thank you]: thank you to you, the people of Hungary. The official song of the Congress has reminded you: 'For a thousand years the cross was the column of your salvation. Now may the sign of Christ be for you also the promise of a better future'. This is what I wish for you: that the Cross be your bridge between the past and the future. Religious sentiment has been the lifeblood of this nation, so attached to its roots. **Yet the Cross, planted in the ground, not only invites us to be well-rooted, it also raises and extends its arms towards everyone.** The cross urges us to keep our roots firm, but without defensiveness; to draw from the wellsprings, opening ourselves to the thirst of the men and women of our time. My wish is that you be like that: **grounded and open, rooted and considerate.** *Isten éltesen!* [God bless you!] The 'MISSION CROSS' is the symbol of this Congress: may it lead you to proclaim with your lives the liberating Gospel of God's boundless love for each person. Amid the present-day famine of love, men and women long for this nourishment.

◆ Today in Warsaw, not far from here, **two individuals who bore witness to the Gospel are being beatified:** *Cardinal Stefan Wyszyński* and *Elizabeth Czacka*, Foundress of the Franciscan Sisters Servants of the Cross. *Both were familiar with the Cross first-hand.* Cardinal Wyszyński, the Primate of Poland, who was arrested and imprisoned, was always a courageous Pastor according to the heart of Christ and a herald of freedom and human dignity. Sister Elizabeth, who as a young girl lost her sight, devoted her whole life to assisting the blind. May the example of these new Blesseds encourage us to transform darkness into light with the power of love.

### A Novena to Mary in October



St. Mary's of the Lake in Lakewood is inviting everyone to join in praying a Novena to Mary on every Tuesday and Thursday and one Wednesday, October 13th after Mass during the month of October (to make the nine days of the Novena). ### GUIDELINES FROM THE DIOCESE [during the time of Covid's Variants]:

- ◆ Parishes are required to **reserve a section** of the Church where social distancing is observed. This section should be clearly marked with appropriate signage.
- ◆ **Masks** are strongly *encouraged* at Mass. For the distribution of Holy Communion, the ordinary and extra-ordinary ministers of Holy Communion should continue to wear a mask for the distribution.
- ◆ Until further notice, Holy Communion under the species of the **Precious Blood** is not to be distributed.
- ◆ Parishioners are reminded by Bishop Ricken that the obligation to attend the Sunday Mass **does not apply** to those individuals who are frail due to illness or age and in their well-formed consciences believe that going into public places - including Sunday worship at Mass - would place their health in 'serious jeopardy', they too are not bound by this obligation.

PLEASE NOTE TIME CHANGE: Those unable to be in church for Mass for health reasons can still tune into the *televised Mass* on WFRV Local 5, celebrated by our Bishop Ricken every **SUN at 7:30 am.**
