



Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Mary's of the Lake:

◆ October (beginning this FRI) is our annual MONTH OF ROSARY. Over the centuries, devotion to the Mary has assumed various forms, and the 'HAIL MARY' is perhaps the most common & familiar devotional prayer. 'Rosary' is the term from Latin *rosarium*, which means 'crown of roses' or 'garland of roses.' The Rosary originated from the Church's liturgical prayer, which used the 150 psalms of the Old Testament, and developed into a way of prayer for people who couldn't read or who didn't have full access to the Bible. Along the history, the Rosary has developed into a Roman Catholic popular prayer in commemoration of Jesus along with *major events of his life, ministry, death and resurrection*. The prayers used in the rosary can be seen as foundational prayers Catholics need to know: 1. Sign of the Cross & Apostles Creed; 2. Lord's Prayer; 3. Hail Marys; 4. Glory Be... The praying of each 10 Hail Marys (*decade*) is accompanied by meditation on one of the 'Mysteries of the Rosary.' The traditional 15 Mysteries of the Rosary are grouped into 3 sets: the Joyful mysteries, the Sorrowful mysteries, and the Glorious mysteries. In 2002 then Pope John Paul II announced a set of 5 new Mysteries called the Luminous mysteries, *bringing the total number of mysteries to 20*. May I invite you to pray the Rosary at home, and teach your children & grandchildren to do the same.

◆ October has also been set aside as our annual RESPECT LIFE MONTH, during which we are especially reminded of ALL LIVES –our own life & the life of the others. LIFE is a great gift from God, who is the source & author of life. This is the God who said: 'Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you!' (*Jer 1:5*). We are called to respect LIFE from the womb to the tomb (from fertilization to natural death). As followers of Jesus we are called to stand for life, to value life, and to respect life in all its stages. I still remember with fond memory the late Cardinal John O'Connor, who was archbishop of New York, and who was a staunch pro-life churchman. He once defined the Pro-Life Movement in this way: 'We are not simply anti-abortion... We are PRO-LIFE, pro the WONDER OF LIFE, pro the JOY OF LIFE... We need to bring the Gospel of Life to the heart of every man and woman and to make it penetrate every part of our society.' As we thank God for the wonderful gift of life; let us praise our God of life: 'You formed my inmost being; you knit me in my mother's womb. I praise you, because I am wonderfully made; wonderful are your works! My very self you know.' (*Ps. 139: 13-14*)
