

Living Kidney Donor Needed!

One of our parishioners is in need of a kidney transplant, and a kidney from a living donor is their best chance of survival.



Living Kidney donors:

- *Must be healthy people who volunteer to donate go through medical evaluation, including education about risks/benefits
- *Can change their minds any time, no questions asked
- *Are generally back to normal activities 4-6 weeks after surgery
- *Are covered by the receivers insurance for all costs related to the donation
- *Do not have to be the same blood type

Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Mary's of the Lake:

♦ 'I rejoiced when they said to me; Let us go to the House of the LORD. And now our feet are standing within your gates, Jerusalem.' When I reflected on these verses from Psalm 122, I could feel the JOY of the pilgrim people of God journeying to Jerusalem and to the Temple for worship. I wondered,



however, 'what was the source of their JOY?' Psalm 43:4 gave me a hint: 'That I may come to the Altar of God, to God, my JOY, my delight.' Psalm 16: 11 also affirms: 'You will show me the path to life, abounding JOY in your presence.' May these verses of the Psalms be an inspiration for us each time we go to church, as we exhort one another, 'Let us go to the House of the Lord!' 'That I may come to the Altar of God, to God, my joy, my delight.' For indeed in His Loving Presence we find **ABOUNDING JOY!**

♦ Recently, I received several samples for posters or church signs, as parish leaders are being encouraged to find ways to 'reengage' or 'reconnect' --showing parishioners and visitors that they are **WELCOME** or **WELCOME BACK** to Church. I'd like to offer you these samples for your reflection: ♦ [Every Sunday] Give your family an hour of faith; ♦ Give your heart an hour of hope; ♦ Give your self an hour of love; ♦ Give your mind an hour of Peace; ♦ Give your soul an hour of prayers; ♦ Give your life an hour with God... *Do you have a preference?* Please join me in inviting those you know to **COME BACK** to church to worship, to listen to the Holy Word of God and to receive the Body and Blood of Jesus truly present in the Holy Eucharist. All things considered, we can certainly remind ourselves that out of 168 hours which God gives us each week, an hour a week for worship on Sunday is reasonably not that much, don't you think? Of course, you are always invited to go to daily Mass when you can, too.

♦ In a recent article Bishop Ricken wrote: 'Why does the church place such a serious priority on Sunday Mass attendance anyway? Very simply put, it is the will of God. Remember the Third Commandment: 'To Keep Holy the Lord's Day.' The Lord's Day for followers of Jesus is Sunday, based upon His Resurrection from the dead...'
