Next Week's Liturgical Readings

January 12, 2020 – THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

1) Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7

2) Acts 10:34-38

3) Matthew 3:13-17

FOCUS: Through our baptism, we are called to a life of discipleship.

The Spirit of God descends upon Jesus at his baptism, and marks the beginning of his public ministry. At our baptism, through water and the Holy Spirit, we are sanctified and made children of God. By the grace of this sacrament, we are awakened to the power of the Spirit in our own lives.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

Isaiah shares the Lord's promise of a servant of the Lord who will come forth and bring justice to the nations. In the second reading, Peter tells those gathered that God shows no partiality. All who fear him and act uprightly are acceptable to him. In the Gospel, Jesus is baptized by John, and the Spirit of God descends upon him.
