**FOCUS:** Fidelity to God's two great commandments sets a good example for others to follow

The Old Testament lists more than 600 laws by which the Israelite people were to live. Jesus, in fulfilling the law, tells us that *the whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments: loving God, and loving our neighbor as ourselves.* Living by God's law is the best advertisement in drawing others to want to know and follow Jesus Christ. Our actions really do speak louder than our words.

**LITURGY OF THE WORD**

In the first reading, the Lord tells the Israelites the laws regarding treatment of aliens, widows, and orphans, and the lending of money to the poor. Paul compliments the Thessalonians for their faith and for becoming *a model for all the believers... not only in Macedonia and in Achaia, but in every place your faith in God has gone forth.* In the Gospel, a scholar of the law tests Jesus, regarding the greatest *commandment in the law.* Jesus answers with two commandments, concerning love of God and love of neighbor.

## POPE FRANCIS' ENCYCLICAL *FRATELLI TUTTI*

Fraternity and social friendship are the ways the Holy Father indicates to build a better, more just and peaceful world, with the contribution of all people and institutions, with a strong confirmation of a 'no' to war and to globalized indifference.

What are the great ideals for those who wish to build a more just and fraternal world in their ordinary relationships, in social life, politics and institutions?

These are the questions that Fratelli Tutti intends to answer: The Pope himself describes it as a "Social Encyclical" which borrows the title of the "Admonitions" of Saint Francis of Assisi, who used these words to address his brothers and sisters and propose a way of life marked by the "flavour of the Gospel".

The Encyclical aims to promote a universal hope toward fraternity and social friendship. The background of the Encyclical is the Covid-19 pandemic that Francis calls "unexpectedly erupted" as he was writing this letter. But the global health emergency has helped demonstrate that "no one can face life in isolation" and that the time has truly come to "dream, then, as a single human family".
