This Week's Liturgical Readings

December 27, 2020 – Christmas

- 1) Genesis 15:1-6; 21:1-3
- 2) Hebrews 11:8, 11-12, 17-19
- 3) Luke 2:22-40

FOCUS: Blessed are those who fear the Lord and walk in his ways.

On this Feast of the Holy Family, we celebrate God's Incarnation into a human family who loved, protected and taught him. They were holy because they were perfect in obedience and virtue; blessed because they walked in his ways. We, too, may strive to attain holiness, in our imitation of the Holy Family's example and through the grace of Christ.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

In today's first reading, God promises Abram an heir, though Abram is very old. Before too long Sarah, his wife, bears him a son. In the second reading, the author of Hebrews tells the story of Abraham (Abram) as an example of true faith in God. In the Gospel, Joseph and Mary take Jesus to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord. The devout Simeon beheld the child Jesus, and prayed to the Lord that he, the Lord's servant might now be dismissed for he had seen the salvation.

ON THE OCCASION OF THE 150TH ANNIVERSARY of the proclamation of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church (8 December 2020), Pope Francis wrote an Apostolic Letter, *Patris Corde* ("With A Father's Heart": that is how Joseph loved Jesus, whom all four Gospels refer to as "the son of Joseph"). Pope Francis dedicated the year from December 8, 2020, to December 8, 2021, to St. Joseph. "The aim of this Apostolic Letter is to increase our love for this great saint, to encourage us to imitate his virtues and his zeal."

But the Church was decorated beautifully and brighten our spirits. Thanks to all who helped make it a worthy place to celebrate the Birth of Jesus. Even our family festivities took on a

different look: for some it was using social media to connect with family but nothing external can dampen the spirit of Christmas. It's all about family. We are people of HOPE, even moving into the lockdown that began this morning.

Please be safe and follow all the restrictions. For the Church, it means that there will be no public Mass, no meetings, no Baptisms or weddings until the lockdown ends. We, your priests, will be celebrating Mass each day for you and for your intentions. Every Sunday the Mass will be livestreamed at 10:00 am, alternating from St. Anne and St. Joseph, starting at St. Joseph this weekend. We will continue the daily Scripture Reflections, sending them by email to the addresses we have, and by posting them on our YouTube Channel, youtube.com/stastj.

Mary Forcier, our Youth Minister, continues online preparation for children receiving First Communion and the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Confirmation in 2021, as well as the programs of our Youth Ministry. The fantastic outreach of our St. Vincent Paul Society to the most vulnerable in the community will still be offered. We ask your prayers and generosity, as always, in showing Christian solidarity.

So, our many services to the community will continue, as well as our normal expenses.
