**This Week's Liturgical Readings**

**February 21, 2021 – First Sunday of Lent**

- 2) 1 Peter 3:18-22
- 3) Mark 1:12-15

**LITURGY OF THE WORD**

In the first reading, God establishes a covenant with Noah and his sons, promising never to flood the earth again. In the second reading, Peter writes to his community about those *in the days of Noah who were saved through water. This prefigured baptism, which is what save them now.* In the Gospel, Jesus is tempted by Satan in the desert. He then goes to Galilee to begin his public ministry.

**OUR CHURCHES HAVE RE-OPENED**

With the welcome announcement of Premier Ford on Friday moving the Province from lockdown to the colour-coded system, Waterloo Region enters the "red zone" on Feb. 16. The Diocese now permits us to gather once again for Mass, weddings and funerals but we are restricted to 30% capacity, as we were before Christmas. All previous rules and restrictions remain in place, such as mandatory mask wearing, maintaining social distancing, hand-sanitizing and disinfecting.

## OUR PARISHES HAVE RE-OPENED

Parish offices are open by appointment only and with very limited public access, following strict guidelines.

## ONLINE FAITH FORMATION FOR LENT

1. CCCB PASTORAL OFFICES have prepared a video series called Journey through Lent: Video Series for Lent 2021. Bishop Gerard Bergie, Bishop of St. Catharines, and Archbishop Marcel Damphousse, Archbishop of Ottawa-Cornwall, will offer reflections on the Sunday readings which are available each Monday prior to the Sundays of Lent. The links for the series in English and in French are available on the CCCB website. It is a safe way to reflect during the Lenten journey this year.

2. FATHER SCOTT LEWIS, S.J., Jesuit Scripture Scholar, will present a series on New Interpretations of the Holy Week Stories, in light of recent theological trends and issues. Topics such as How to Read the Bible, difficult passages, violence, and the meaning of the Resurrection will be explored.
