This Week's Liturgical Readings

May 9, 2021 – 6th Sunday of Easter

- 1) Acts 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48
- 2) 1 John 4:7-10
- 3) John 15:9-17

FOCUS: Love one another; the commandment is not always easy to follow, but it is always good.

Jesus commands us to love one another. As he laid down his life, we imitate Jesus in laying down our lives and loving others. The command, though difficult, comes with a purpose and promise. We remain in him and our joy will be complete. We can love others and bear fruit in Christ, if we remain firmly rooted to him.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

In the 1st reading, as Peter visits Cornelius and tells him that *whoever fears [God] and acts uprightly is acceptable to him*, the Holy Spirit falls upon all who were listening. John writes, *Beloved, let us love one another, because love is of God*. God's love was revealed in his Son whom he sent for our salvation, In the Gospel, Jesus tells his disciples to remain in his love and to love one another as he has loved them. *For no one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends.*
