This Week's Liturgical Readings

July 11, 2021 – 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

- 1) Amos 7:12-15
- 2) Ephesians 1:3-14 or 1:3-10
- 3) Mark 6:7-13

FOCUS: Share the Good News with all who will listen.

In the first reading and the Gospel, Amos and the Apostles are sent to convey God's perfect message, which tends to make sinners feel uneasy. Like Amos, confronting sin may not have been on our original to-do list. But how else can we open our hearts to receive the grace to boldly go forth to share the Good News to all who might listen?

LITURGY OF THE WORD

In the first reading, Amaziah tries to move the prophet Amos away from the royal temple. Saint Paul praises God for his adoption of all people to himself through Jesus Christ. In Mark's Gospel, Jesus sends the Twelve out in pairs, giving them instructions on how to approach their ministry with simplicity.
