Featured Saint – Elizabeth Ann Seton

Elizabeth Ann Seton is the first native-born American to be canonized a saint! She was raised in upper-class New York, and after her husband died, she further embraced God and converted to Catholicism. Her love of the Bread of Life and Blessed Virgin Mary led her to open Catholic schools and orphanages in the United States and Italy. She died in 1821 at the age of 46, and her feast day is January 4.
