# A WORD FROM FR. JOHN...

As we enter the Third Week of Lent, we are entering the heart of our Lenten offerings focused on the Eucharist. Today and Wednesday, we will have an opportunity to come together and view the film, *Babette's Feast*, in preparation for our discussion led by our parishioner and nationally-known film critic, Jack Garner, on this Thursday evening at St. Mary's Dugan Center. After feasting our eyes and minds, we will have an opportunity to fill our stomachs with a scrumptious feast at the **Men's Club St. Patrick's Day Dinner** on Saturday, March 10<sup>th</sup> in St. Boniface School following the evening Mass. After nourishing our bodies, we again will have an opportunity to feed our minds, hearts and souls, at our **Parish Lenten Retreat** focused on the Eucharist and led by Dr. Ella Johnson, starting next Sunday afternoon, March 11<sup>th</sup>. The retreat will continue Monday and Tuesday with the same sessions offered at 1:30 and repeated at 6:30 each day. In conjunction with the Sunday afternoon and two evening sessions, we will have an opportunity to gather together to share a simple meal in friendship and fellowship. Please come to as many of the session of our retreat as possible. Each session will stand on its own, but the whole will be greater than the sum of its parts. Ahead of the retreat, you can visit our website to view a video, in which Ella Johnson introduces herself to our parish.

Once again, the **Day of Penance** will offer opportunities to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance with individual confession in churches throughout our diocese from noon to 7:00 PM on Wednesday, March 14th. We again will be offering copies of Examinations of Conscience for Children, Youth and Adults at our churches or on our website to help prepare to celebrate the sacrament on that day, any Wednesday evening following Stations of the Cross, at the regular times on Saturdays, or by appointment. More information about preparing for and celebrating the Sacrament of Penance, including some interesting videos, are available on the website: forgiven.dor.org. We also will have hardcopies of materials at each of our churches that day. If you are concerned about going to confession to a priest who knows you, then consider visiting another parish, since they will all be offering the sacrament that day. In addition, we have invited some guest priests to hear confessions in our parish on the Day of Penance. When we have finalized a schedule, we will share their times and locations with you.

If you have not yet had a chance, then please visit our **new parish website**. The address is the same (SoutheastRochesterCatholics.org), but the accessibility and appearance have been enhanced. Please direct any concerns or comments to Kathy Marfione in our parish office. We are always looking for ways to improve the experience of those who visit and make use of our site.

Please pray for our RCIA candidates as they continue their preparations to be received fully into the Church through the Sacraments of Confirmation and the Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. Also, keep praying for our young candidates for First Holy Communion, their families and catechists, as they get ready for this significant step in their faith journey.

Our Catholic Ministries Appeal In-Pew Solicitation netted over 60 additional donations in our collections across our three churches. Hopefully, it spurred others to consider joining those donors whose generosity has moved us a long way to achieving our goals. Because of a lag in processing and reporting those donations by the diocese, we probably won't see the net effect of our efforts until sometime this coming week. I am hopeful that we soon will reach our goal in one, if not two, of our churches. Again, I thank you for your time and patience, as while this exercise may have been disruptive for some, it appears to have produced beneficial results that my prior urgings in this column had not.

As we approach the half way point, may a renewed commitment to our Lenten practices spurred by the offerings in our parish over the next few weeks lead us to a joyous celebration of renewal and transformation at Easter.

### RENEWING AND REFRESHING ADULT FAITH

"Man does not live by bread alone." With this statement Jesus exhorts Satan and us that there is more than the physical nature of humans. Often in my physical life I am asked to fast. Preparation for lab tests, procedures and surgery all require freedom from food. There are also times in my spiritual life when fasting is a practice.

A short fast prior to receiving Holy Communion empties me to make room for God as I receive Jesus, fully sharing in His sacrifice at Mass. Ash Wednesday reminds me of my mortality and awakens me to the responsibility that I have to make time for God, my <u>eternal</u> Father.

Good Friday's fast relives for me the true cost that precedes the conquering of death and the reward of eternal life. Fasting is not always about food. Any activity or addiction that disturbs my spiritual nature is subject to this self-denial. I believe fasting is always a preparation. My age relieves me of the obligation. Fasting then becomes an opportunity to freely choose how I unite the physical and spiritual growth that deepens my faith and prepares me for eternity.

Spiritual focus, self-discipline, imitation of Christ and performing penance can be the fruitful results of fasting. As I continue on my journey, I am truly aware of the benefits of preparation and sincerely grateful that practices of fasting, prayer and almsgiving provide simple ways to arrive at my destination.
