A WORD FROM FR. JOHN...

After the wonderful goodbye reception for Fr. Matthew last Sunday, the early part of last week was busy with comings and goings. Fr. Ed Palumbos, who reached senior priest status and finished his time as pastor of the Church of the Assumption and the Church of the Resurrection in Fairport, dropped off a load of belongings on Monday. He will be living with us at St. Mary's rectory and ministering in our parish on a regular basis starting around Christmas time. Until then, he will be staying at his retreat in the hills, resting, relaxing and traveling. Fr. Matthew left St. Mary's rectory with a final load of belongings about mid-morning on Tuesday, headed to his new assignment shepherding the churches in Corning. And Fr. Felicjan arrived with a carload of belongings in the evening, eager to begin his new assignment with us as our parochial vicar. He will be presiding at the 4:00PM and 10:30AM Masses at St. Mary's and the 9:00AM Mass at St. Boniface this week, and then at the other three Masses at St. Boniface and Blessed Sacrament the following weekend. I trust that you will welcome Fr. Felicjan with the same kindness and patient understanding that you have shown me.

I am anxious to see how a summer unfolds in our parish. While many parish groups and programs often take July and August off, that doesn't necessarily mean that nothing is happening. Certainly, this break offers an opportunity to pause, reflect and plan for the coming year's ministry and activities. Yet, at the same time, there are opportunities to gather for fun and fellowship at the **All Parish Summer Social Pulled Pork Picnic Lunch** in July and the **August Theater Trip**. Our children will have an opportunity to gather for a week of faith and fun at **Vacation Bible Camp** the final full week in July. (We appreciate everyone who has taken a tag from the boards in church to help us gather the needed supplies for VBC). Faith Formation opportunities for adults are also offered through Sr. Kathleen's "Reflecting on the Psalms while enjoying the gift of God's creation," and by following along with our **Renewing and Refreshing Adult Faith** column in this bulletin. Each week will offer a reflection by a parishioner on a different section of Pope Francis' Call to Holiness in his Apostolic Exhortation: *Gaudete et Exultate (Rejoice and Be Glad)*. As with Pope Francis' other works, this one is much more readable and relatable than some of the heavier papal works that we were required to read in seminary. There are rumblings that our universal call to holiness, emphasized in the Second Vatican Council document, *Lumen gentium*, may be a central theme of our parish faith formation efforts in the coming year as the Eucharist was this last year. Regardless, this easily digestible document is a great way for all of us to reflect on our call to holiness. Lastly, one of the things that I enjoy about summer in our area are the locally grown fruits and vegetables. While many have their favorite stands or enjoy the Public Market in the city, don't forget about the **Monroe Village Farmers Market** that takes place on Wednesdays, 4:00-7:00pm in the Blessed Sacrament parking lot until October.



Of course, beyond our parish, there are countless opportunities to get out and enjoy the outdoors whether camping, hiking, boating, swimming, fishing, sports or picnicking, as well as innumerable festivals and gatherings. Remember all work and no play makes Jack a dull lad. As we strive for holiness, we shouldn't settle for being bored or boring. The Holy Spirit who dwells among us is too full of surprises to let that be the case.

In the end, while it might turn out that the demands of your summer schedule don't offer you many opportunities for fun and relaxation, hopefully you are able to carve out some time to honor our physical and spiritual need for a Sabbath rest to do some reflecting and re-creating. We are all better for it when we do.

RENEWING AND REFRESHING ADULT FAITH

Each week for the summer, a parishioner will reflect on a section of Pope Francis' Call to Holiness: his new Apostolic Exhortation *Gaudete et Exsultate* (Rejoice and Be Glad), which you can read at <http://w2.vatican.va>

Our Mission in Christ (paragraphs 19-34)

In the song on the Beatitudes we hear the words "rejoice and be glad, yours is the kingdom of God." In his Apostolic Exhortation of the same name Pope Francis encourages us not to be afraid of holiness. Holiness, he says, "will not take away our energy, vitality, or joy. Instead it will assist us in becoming what God had in mind when He created us and will help us recognize our great dignity." So, what are some causes of our fear of holiness?

Causes include: Not utilizing the Spirit to assist us in all our decision making. Forgetting that our personal mission is part of the kingdom Christ brought to earth and not a separate entity. Failing to identify with His will, which involves a personal commitment to work with Him in building His kingdom of love, justice, and universal peace. Ignoring the fact that "Life does not have a mission but *is* a mission." Accepting the challenge that everything we do has an evangelical meaning and identifies with Christ. Doing things out of anxiety, pride, or the need to impress others **does** not lead to holiness.

So, what actions *do* lead to holiness? A good starting point is spending quiet time with God. Finding that place and utilizing it might be painful but is fruitful and powerful. Allowing the Holy Spirit to guide us to a place of holiness which can integrate both solitude and service, so our every moment is a reflection of self-sacrificing in Christ's eyes.

Make a retreat or take a day to call your own. A good resource is Mercy Spirituality Center (585-473-6893). Or use on-line resources such as pray-as-you-go.org.

When you do find your own place of serenity you will rejoice and be glad for the kingdom of God will be yours.

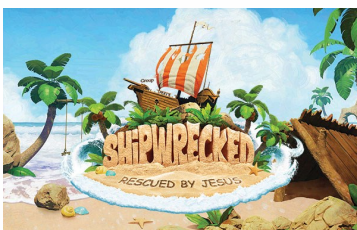

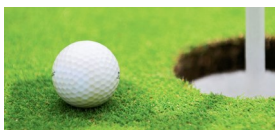
