A Note From Father Felicjan

I was born and raised in Poland and come from a very religious family. My father was a farmer and worked as a maintenance worker in a government building. My mom stayed home and took care of raising six children. I have now two brothers and two sisters. One of my brothers, John, passed away in 2011 at the age 38.

After graduation from high school, I entered the Seminary in Poland. After six years of formation in a Theological University, I was ordained as a priest. I was ordained to priesthood in 1990 at the age of 26.

Before coming to the United States, I served in the Lord's vineyard as a parochial vicar and teacher of religion in Kamianna and Cracow. Also, I was a Vice Superior of my congregation of St. Philip Neri. I was also a Priest of Oratory of Saint Philip Neri, and belonged to the Congregation of the Oratory, St. Philip Neri. I came to the United States in 2000.

After arriving in the United States, I was appointed as a Sacramental Minister serving our Lord in the gracious and loving community of Good Shepherd Catholic Communities. This community encompasses Churches in the towns of Scipo Center, Cayuga, Union Spring, King Ferry, Aurora, Moravia, and Lyons. I then spent 12 years in Auburn, which consisted of Sacred Heart, St. Ann, St. Francis, and St. Hyacinth.

At that time, I was also a Chaplain at Mercy Rehabilitation Center and Chaplain for the New York State Department of Corrections and Community Supervision. Before coming here to fill the role of parochial vicar with the Southeast Rochester Catholic Community of Blessed Sacrament, St. Boniface, and St. Mary's, I served as parochial vicar at Our Lady of the Lakes at St. Michael's in Penn Yan, St. Januarius in Naples, St. Teresa's in Stanley, and St. Patrick's in Prattsburgh.

I look forward to actively providing religious services to this parish family for many years to come! I want to mention, that I believe the first call for us all as parishioners is to the Holy life of prayer. The Eucharist (Mass) is the source and summit of our lives and is the best prayer. I believe we should be well educated in the Catholic faith and develop a strong sense of community. We are called to help one another.

There are no meetings without influence. A meeting with other people always leaves a trace—either good or bad. We are not "neutral". In any meeting a person leaves part of themselves and others leave something with us, even if you do not feel and do not see it with the naked eye. I have many memories, and all of the memories left footprints in my heart and mind. I look forward to my ministry here with you, and getting to know all of you, and making good memories!

RENEWING AND REFRESHING ADULT FAITH

Subtle Enemies of Holiness: Gnosticism

Continuing our reflection on Pope Francis' Apostolic Exhortation, *Gaudete et Exsultate (Rejoice and Be Glad)*, I would like to share a few thoughts on Chapter Two, "Two Subtle Enemies of Holiness." Pope Francis calls to our attention two false forms of holiness: gnosticism and pelagianism. In many ways, these two heresies of early Christian times are two sides of the same coin. While gnosticism places undue emphasis on the intellect as the means of our salvation, pelagianism attributes to human will or personal effort the means by which we better ourselves and make ourselves saints. These seductively deceptive ideas both err in dismissing the role of mystery and grace in our salvation.

Gnosticism in its contemporary form puts forward a model of salvation that is merely interior, and consists in elevating oneself with the intellect beyond the flesh. It thus presumes to liberate the human person from the body and from the material universe. Falling prey to this way of thinking leads one to privilege one's own explanation of the entirety of the faith and the Gospel as perfectly comprehensible. With undue confidence, one then seeks to impose one's way of thinking on others.

As Pope Francis makes clear, since God infinitely transcends us (God is full of surprises), it is not easy to grasp the truth that God reveals to us and even more difficult to express it. Thus, our understanding and expression of doctrine is not a closed system, but one that values the questions, suffering, struggles, dreams, trials and worries of ordinary people as prisms through which we view and interpret doctrine. In the mystery of the incarnation, the Son of God took on flesh and lived as a human being to reveal God fully to us. As we respond to the call to holiness, we freely accept and humbly receive God's gift of grace as we walk our journey of transformation in the flesh and among our fellow human beings.

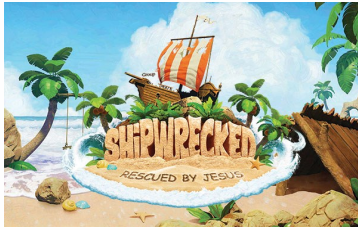

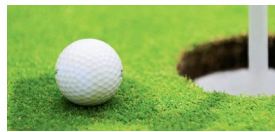
