A WORD FROM FR. JOHN...

Here we are on the Fifth Sunday of Easter more than halfway through the Easter season with just three weeks to go before Pentecost. The more that I have been reflecting on our scripture readings, the more I have been struck with how much they have to do with the formation of the Church as we endeavor to live out the reality of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Our gospel stories have focused on the disciples coming to terms with what Jesus' dying and rising means for them individually and collectively. We see them struggling to understand at first that Jesus is alive, but alive in a new way beyond anything that they have experienced before. At that same time, the disciples are being invited to share the good news of Jesus Christ with others such that they come to believe and follow Jesus Christ as well. Repeatedly, the disciples come to recognize and experience our Risen Lord as they gather for a shared meal that recalls the elements of the Last Supper that Jesus called us to do in remembrance of him. The bread and wine are taken, blessed, broken and shared as the body and blood of Christ in the Eucharist. Peter, the Rock on which Christ builds up his body into the church, becomes a model of church leadership as he is reconciled with Jesus in threefold declaration of love and charged with feeding and tending the lambs and sheep that make up God's flock. At the same time, we hear stories from the Acts of the Apostles, in which those who are a part of the body of Christ, God's flock, the church, follow Jesus by doing what Jesus did in healing, preaching and teaching others that leads them to faith in Jesus Christ, the Son of God and Savior.

At the same time, elements of our liturgies point to this same generating, regenerating and building up of the church. Right from the renewal of our baptismal promises on Easter Sunday, through the repeated sprinkling rite in place of the penitential act in the introduction to Mass, to the prominence given to the Paschal Candle that stands in a prominent place next to the ambo and is lit at every Mass, along with our celebration of Baptism, Confirmation and First Communion, the season seems to celebrate our initiation into full membership in the Church. Of course, this all will culminate in the celebration of Pentecost, when the focus shifts from God in the flesh to God in the Spirit, and we mark the "birthday" of the church in the descent of the Holy Spirit on those gathered and praying in Jesus' name.

All of this is apropos, as we call on that same Spirit to guide our parish community, as we come together on Monday, May 20 for an All Parish Gathering at Blessed Sacrament to plan and organize the next steps in our renewal and regeneration. As I have mentioned previously, we will draw on ideas especially those offered in our Town Hall style meetings, along with whatever the Spirit may move us to share to address the many challenges that our church's face individually and collectively. Those ideas that engender the most energy and support from those gathered will become the basis for planning and organizing our next steps. I foresee this leading to a series of follow up discussions and actions by teams and committees of volunteers who will help to drive the process forward in the coming months that will lead to constructive actions that bear fruit for our parish with the help and guidance of God. I thank everyone who has taken the time to be a part of the process so far. I am hopeful that as we gather on Monday evening in the lower level of the school at 7:00pm, we will be open to hear the voice of Christ speaking in one another, as we make use of the gifts of the Holy Spirit (i.e. Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Courage, Knowledge, Reverence, and Wonder and Awe in the presence of God) to give evidence of the fruits of the Holy Spirit (i.e. Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, and Self-control) in our interactions with one another. Members of all three churches of our parish are invited to come and participate in this All Parish Gathering.

Just another quick reminder, all donations and payments in fulfillment of pledges to the Catholic Ministries Appeal must be received and recorded by the diocese by Friday, May 31, 2019 to count toward the goals of our parish churches. As I have indicated previously, the diocese will bill us for any shortfall in reaching our goals. We will use the donations to the "shortfall fund" at each of our churches to cover or help defray this expense. Donations to those shortfall funds will be accepted through the end of June. Thank you to all who have supported our parish with your prayers and contributions. May God reward you for your kindness and generosity.

RENEWING AND REFRESHING ADULT FAITH

St. Mary's Window Tour

During the month of May, we focus on our Blessed Mother, looking to her for special prayers and inspiration. It is a perfect time to take in the beauty of St. Mary's stained glass windows. First designated as The Church of St. Mary of the Assumption, the entire church is filled with different depictions of Mary.

The Assumption window is directly in front of us as we face the altar. Designed in what we call the Munich Style, it resembles a painting more than the other windows. It represents in a fairly life-like style the Assumption (going up to heaven) of Mary. She, like Jesus, was "assumed" into heaven, body and soul. We celebrate this event every year on August 15. We can see skin tones of Mary and even the angels around her. The colors are softer than the primary colors of the windows in the Nave and the Transept.

The "partner" window, to the left of the Assumption, shows Mary at the Annunciation, when the Angel Gabriel announces that she was to be the Mother of Jesus. The style, also Munich, mirrors the other window. The "paintings" are created directly in the glass and have lasted in wonderful shape since they were installed in 1888, more than 100 years ago.

Please join us on the weekend of **June 22/23**, at open houses at St. Mary's, in the late afternoon, to learn more about our church's history, through the windows.
