## **A WORD FROM FR. JOHN...**

This weekend is full of celebrations to our parish. First, we are celebrating the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, also known as *Corpus Christi*, which is Latin for "Body of Christ." As such it draws our attention to the Body of Christ in two senses. First and primarily, the feast focuses on the real presence of Christ in the Most Holy Eucharist. As St. Paul points out in our second reading this Sunday, Jesus commanded his disciples to celebrate the Eucharist in remembrance of him until the end of time. We do so faithfully each time we gather offering praise and worship of God at Mass for this great gift. That points to a link to the second focus of this feast, the Body of Christ as it is present in the Church. We, the Church, form the Body of Christ through the intimate communion that Jesus shares with us as his disciples. In the gospels, Jesus makes this connection for us by using a metaphor of a body in which he is the head. This metaphor allows for both the unity and the diversity which characterize the Church. As the feast day of the Church of the Blessed Sacrament, we fittingly mark this day with our celebration of the Body of Christ in the Eucharist at Mass and in the Eucharistic Adoration with Benediction following the 12:15pm Mass from 1:30-2:30pm at Blessed Sacrament.

This weekend we also are celebrating the 185th anniversary of the founding of St. Mary's Church with an Open House that includes tours of our beautiful church and stained glass windows, an historical display, music in the garden and refreshments. As this falls on the opening weekend of the Rochester International Jazz Festival which is making use of GEVA as a venue this year, we have an opportunity to welcome a number of those visiting our neighborhood, as well as many who live or work downtown. While the Jazz Fest crowds will be concentrated around the evening concert times, the activities following the 10:30am Mass at St. Mary's offer an opportunity for all the members of our community to stop by for a visit and join in the celebration. May God bless us with the success that we had at our recent Chicken BBQ at St. Boniface.

May these events set a good tone for us as many of our regular ministries take a hiatus for the summer, but we continue to gather for the celebration of the Eucharist each weekend, and undertake a variety of activities during the summer months. As I highlighted in the bulletin last week, these include: Summer Bible Study focusing on the Acts of the Apostles on Monday evenings from June 10-July 29; Red Wings baseball game on July 13; PlayROCs Your Neighborhood also on July 13; Vacation Bible Camp the week of July 22-26, 9:00am-Noon; Grilling with God on July 27; Gateways Music Fest on August 11; and our Parish Picnic on August 18.

At the same time, our parish will be going through some significant transitions. This weekend is Fr. Felicjan's last with us before he starts his new position as a full time hospital chaplain. Receptions will be held after the 5:00PM Mass at St. Boniface and 10:00AM Mass at Blessed Sacrament, as we wish him well in his new assignment. Fr. Mike Mayer, who is taking Fr. Felicjan's place as our new parochial vicar, will be moving in this Tuesday, June 25 and starting his ministry with us. I know that you will welcome him with the same kindness that you have shown Fr. Felicjan, Fr. Ed Palumbos and myself. Next weekend, we will welcome back Fr. Ed, a senior priest living in residence at St. Mary's rectory, who served with us briefly following his retirement as pastor of the Church of the Assumption in Fairport, before filling in as temporary parochial administrator at St. Christopher's in North Chili. On that same weekend, we also will honor Beverly LaBelle, our pastoral associate, who is retiring after 21 years of service to our parish. Receptions will be held after the 10:00AM and 12:15PM Masses on June 30 at Blessed Sacrament to thank her and wish her well in her retirement. At the same time, as was arranged many months ago, before all these changes came into play, Maryknoll Fr. Mike Sloboda and Deacon Paul Bork will be giving our Summer Mission Appeal at all three churches in our parish on June 29 & 30.

As I indicated previously, we will not be hiring a replacement for Beverly and Deacon David Palma, another pastoral associate, is cutting back to half-time as he pursues other interests. I am grateful to those who have been stepping forward to help us cover some of their duties and responsibilities. While we would be grateful for more volunteers, especially in helping to support liturgies at Blessed Sacrament, I am confident that our community will rally around to sustain and advance the mission and ministry of our parish.

One area where we will be experiencing some changes starting on July 1 are the times when Blessed Sacrament will be open. Our goal is to have the church open by 7:30am on Monday and Wednesday before 8:00am daily Mass, and by 9:00am on Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. The church will be locked during the week at 4:00pm. On Sundays, our goal is to have the church unlocked at 9:00am and locked up after the 12:15pm Mass. I imagine that will not affect most of you. For those who are affected, I ask for your patience and understanding as we go through this transition process.

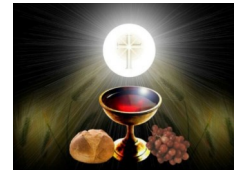
## **ST. MARY'S 185TH ANNIVERSARY OPEN HOUSE A CELEBRATION WITH MUSIC IN THE GARDEN**

During the winter months of January, February, and March, our parish engaged in reading and discussing Matthew Kelly's book *The Biggest Lie in the History of Christianity*. People commented on the concept of Holy Moments. Some began to "practice" creating them; others noticed them; many wanted to share them.

Moving into the summer months of June, July, and August, we want to hear from you. In the spirit of our all-parish read, "let's talk about the beautiful truth that Holy Moments are possible in practical terms. Let's make it real and bring it to life with everyday examples that we can all relate to." What *are* "holy moments," you ask? "A Holy Moment is a moment when you open yourself to God. You make yourself available to him... when you are being the person God created you to be."

We are encouraging you to send us the holy moments that you have experienced. You can send a single moment, several moments; it can be short or long. We will publish them in this column —because, as our book reminds us, "Holy Moments are contagious."
