## ***A WORD FROM FR. JOHN...***

This Sunday, we hear the parable of the Good Samaritan, as Jesus answers a scholar of the law's question about who is our neighbor that we are supposed to love as ourselves. This parable is familiar to all of us. Yet, when we consider what Jesus tells us in that parable, we realize that he doesn't really tell us who our neighbor is. Instead, he tells us how we are to be a neighbor to others. Thus, it is not a question of us identifying who is and who is not our neighbor, or who is and who is not worthy of even being considered our neighbor. Instead, the question that we ask ourselves is; "Are we ready to become a neighbor to all those we encounter, especially those who are in need?" In other words, Jesus does not give us a filtering mechanism that excludes someone from being our neighbor. As a Christian, a follower of Jesus, we strive to be a neighbor to everyone else with no exceptions.

This can be particularly challenging in a culture that promotes segregating things by likes. That is "like" both in the sense of a preference for someone or something, as well as in the sense of similar or shared characteristics among different people or things. We like what we choose to like. And we tend to flock together with those who are like us, even going so far as to exclude those who are not like us. This is perhaps most obvious to users of Facebook, Instagram and other social media platforms that allow a user to grant or withhold their personal "like" of a person or post. Some place a certain caché on the number of "friends" or "followers" that someone accumulates, as if they were trophies or prizes in a contest. But, this plays out in other areas including where we choose to live, who we associate with, who we invite in and keep out of a group, organization, activity or country.

As we consider how both likes play out in our lives and our world, we remain mindful of what Jesus repeatedly teaches us in this regard. Being a good Christian, a good neighbor, is not about us collecting "friends" and "followers" who are like us or liked by us. As disciples of Jesus Christ, we strive to make ourselves followers and friends of Christ as we befriend the Christ in everyone we encounter, whether we like them or not, whether they are like us or not. For in being a neighbor as the Good Samaritan was to the victim, we seek to invite others to join us as followers and friends of Christ.

Looking ahead to events in our parish, I invite you to join me in praying for the participants in our Vacation Bible Camp held at Blessed Sacrament that they have a fun-filled, faith-filled and safe week. I encourage anyone in their 20s and 30s to attend the Grilling with God event at St. Boniface on Saturday, July 27 (see the article on page 5). Also, please be sure to mark your calendars for the Gateway Music Festival on Sunday, August 18th, as a part of which we will welcome young African-American Classical musicians to our 10:30am Mass at St. Mary's. Lastly, I hope that you are planning to join us for fun, food and fellowship at our All Parish Picnic on Sunday, August 18, from 11:30am to 2:30pm, in the Carmen Clark Lodge at Brighton Town Park.

As part of the church's ongoing efforts to Create A Safe Environment for children, youth and vulnerable adults, the diocese publishes a quarterly newsletter aimed at helping all of us keep children and vulnerable adults safe at home, at church and in all places in our community. The summer issue released this past week contains important information about the New York State attorney general's investigation, impending litigation under the Child Victim's Act, the independent diocesan program of reconciliation and compensation of victims, the listing of those credibly accused, the prospects of the diocese filing for bankruptcy, and the membership and work of the Diocesan Review Board, that provides guidance and advice to Bishop Matano in assessing sexual-abuse allegations and determining whether accused people are suitable to continue in ministry. I hope that you take a moment to read through this four-page newsletter to be better informed and able to address the questions and concerns that others may raise. We have put a link to the newsletter on our parish website, and hardcopies will be made available in our churches for those without access to the internet.

One final note, starting in this bulletin, we will be publishing attendance figures for each of the weekend Masses at our three parish worship sites. Since few of you attend more than one Mass, this will give everyone an overall picture of attendance to go along with the already reported information about our collections. I don't think it is a secret to any of us that all three of our parish worship sites continue to face significant challenges with both attendance and collections. We will continue to follow-up on the ideas coming out of our May 20th all parish gathering as we look for ways to increase engagement as a key to driving our numbers in a positive direction.

Peace and blessings wherever your plans may take you this summer.

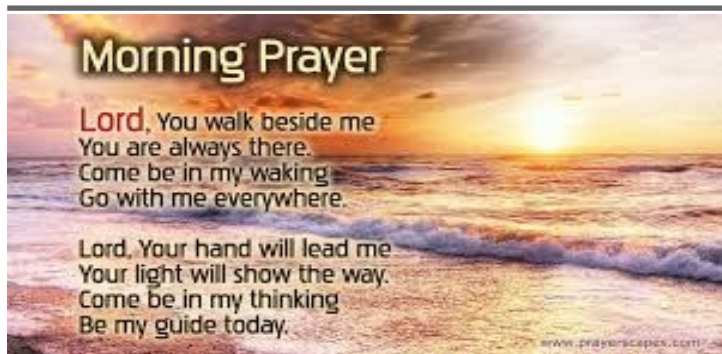
