### A WORD FROM FR. JOHN...

September is here! Put on your seatbelts and hold onto your hats! A lot is going to be coming our way over the next several weeks. Following quickly on the heels of Labor Day and the start of school, we will launch into our Faith Formation program on Sat. & Sun., Sept. 14th & 15th, as we mark **Catechetical Sunday**. It's not too late to register. Sign-up forms are available on our parish website or by contacting Sr. Kathleen Wayne, our parish Director of Faith Formation. Our monthly Saturday evening family program will kick off following the 4:00pm Mass at St. Mary's. And our Sunday morning classroom based program will start up at 9:00am the following day leading into the 10:00am Mass at Blessed Sacrament. We will be blessing our wonderful group of volunteer catechists at both Masses, asking for God's grace as they help to foster the faith of our children and youth.

That same weekend, our youth who will be going to the National Catholic Youth Conference in November will be running a **Can & Bottle Drive along with a Bake Food Sale** to raise funds for their trip at all of our churches. So, please save your returnable can and bottles and bring them to Mass that weekend, along with your sweet tooth. If past sales are any indication, you are bound to walk away with a delectable delight.

Also that weekend, we will start accepting donations on Sat., Sept. 14th through Sat., Sept. 26th, to our **Next-To-New Sale** at Blessed Sacrament. While you are clearing out your returnable cans and bottles, you might consider making a clean sweep of it by bringing along any items that you no longer have use of that we could sell at this important parish fundraiser. Please also consider volunteering some of your time during the Set-up (Sept. 13th-30th), Sale (Oct. 3rd-5th) and Clean-up (Oct. 5th) portions. We can use your help whether you can gives us several days or just a few hours. Please keep an eye out for the volunteer sign-up form or contact the Parish Office.

In addition, on that same weekend, we will be sharing with you more information about Bishop Robert Barron's book, *Letter to a Suffering Church*, and how we hope to make use of it to help us process and discuss our feelings and reactions to clerical sexual abuse in our church, and to begin a conversation about possible ways forward for ourselves and our parish. That will be in preparation for our making the books available for those who chose to take and read one on the weekend of Sat. & Sun., Sept. 21st & 22nd. Our intention is to form small book discussion groups that will begin meeting the week of Oct. 6th, to be followed by opportunities to share and reflect in larger gatherings starting at the end of October. A group of parishioners has been working with our staff and me to create a study guide to aid that process. While there were a range of reactions to the book, the group agreed that it provided a basis to start important and necessary conversations in our parish.

Also, on Sept. 14th &15th, we will be rolling out information about a **Census and Registration Process** that we will be undertaking this fall. This effort is an outgrowth of one the groups that formed following our All-Parish Town Hall meeting last May. A dedicated group of parishioners has been meeting and working throughout the summer to prepare. It is our hope that this process will allow us to (re-)connect with parishioners (some of whom may have drifted away) and those who attend our Masses, and to open up opportunities to explore ways we can serve their needs and invite them to consider using their gifts and talents in the various ministries of our parish.

On the final weekend in September, we will be holding three sessions to review and discuss our **Annual Financial Report to the Parish**, covering our past fiscal year, July 1, 2018-June 30, 2019. We suspect that there may be increased interest in these matters among parishioners following our meetings last March, which highlighted concerns with declining attendance and contributions in all three of our parish churches, as well as concerns raised by reporting on the claims against the diocese and parish under the Child Victims Act. So, we will be holding one session at each of churches following the 4:00pm, 9:00am and 10:00am Masses on Sat. & Sun., Sept. 28th & 29th.

I encourage you to be present for and attentive to as many of these September events as possible. We will be offering various materials through our bulletin, on posters, on our website and in hardcopy to take with you in order to keep everyone informed, especially those of you who won't be able to be with us. I thank you in advance for your time, open-mindedness, support and cooperation with these various parish endeavors.
