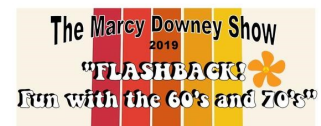

## ***A WORD FROM FR. JOHN...***

In my bulletin column on August 4th, I indicated that thanks to a generous donation by a parishioner, our parish would be making use of Bishop Robert Barron's newly released book, *Letter to a Suffering Church*, as a starting point for conversations and discussions in our parish about the impact of the revelations concerning child sex abuse in the Catholic Church. We hope to create a context in which those affected directly or indirectly can express, process and discuss our thoughts, feelings and emotions about what has been and continues to be revealed about the sexual abuse of children by clergy and others in the church, as well as about the abuse of power and authority in the handling of victims, their reports and the alleged perpetrators of that abuse. All of that has stirred up powerful emotions in many of us that demand a response. We view this book as a starting point in coming to terms with and formulating our own responses.

In his book, Bishop Barron, speaking only for himself and not in anyway on behalf of the Church, lays out for us the path he took in coming to grips with the sexual abuse scandal that for him, many other Catholics, and especially for the victim-survivors, has been a lacerating experience. He has written this book for his "fellow Catholics who feel, understandably, demoralized, scandalized, angry beyond words, and ready to quit," (p.i). In coming to grips with the scandalous abuse in the Church, he readily acknowledges the horrendous evil unleashed by the choices and actions of priests, bishops and others in the Church, and how that has led to frustration, anguish, and fury among many who are asking themselves why they should stay. In reaching the conclusion, where he urges others not to leave the Church, but to stay and fight, he examines four areas. He looks to scripture for passages that shed light on our present situation. He notes that the Church has experienced similar crises in the past and survived. He contends that everything that we love in the Church is still present and worth defending. And finally, he sees a path forward for the Church, calling for serious institutional reforms and a deep and abiding spiritual renewal, while trusting that God will once again inspire women and men to lead a movement of renewal like those led by Benedict, Francis of Assisi, Ignatius Loyola, Theresa of Kolkata, and Dorothy Day.

Judging from the reactions of those who have read the book in helping us to prepare a study guide, which will be offered along with the book next weekend, what Bishop Barron offers will not satisfy everyone. And that is okay. Much as Bishop Barron did, we all need to discover the resources in scripture and tradition, and from our own experience and the experience of others, including the history of the church, that will help us as we process our thoughts, feelings and emotions

and attempt to come to grips with what this means for us, our faith, our church and our life in Christ. We are not offering this book, because it provides *the answer* to the sex abuse crisis in the Church. We are encouraging everyone to take a copy and read this book, because in doing so, it provides a basis for both our own individual work and our coming together and starting much needed discussions of various aspects of the sexual abuse crisis.

In the coming weeks, we will invite you to join small discussion groups that we are forming or to consider forming one among friends and family or among those you serve with in various ministries. We envision those groups starting to meet the week of October 6th, for at least two sessions, possibly more at the discretion of the group members. Along with the study guide, we also are preparing a facilitator's guide and additional materials to support those who take on this important role. Much like the book, all of these materials are offered as a starting point and possible framework to approach the task at hand. We need to remain open to the promptings of the Spirit and the sense and needs of those gathered. We cannot lose sight of the gift that we can be to one another in allowing our fellow parishioners and participants the opportunity to "tell their stories" about the impact of these scandals on their lives in an open, safe and holy context. Towards the end of October and into November, we will hold larger all-parish gatherings after Masses and on a weekday afternoon and evening open to everyone, at which time we can continue to share reactions, thoughts and possible ways forward for our parish and the larger Church.

Starting next weekend, I encourage you to pick up a copy of *Letter to a Suffering Church* and read it. In doing so, we have an opportunity to engage in a process that will aid us in coming to grips with the impact of the sexual abuse crisis. I hope that you will participate in the opportunities for frank and open conversations and discussions that arise. With the gift of God's grace and guided by the Holy Spirit, may this process aid us in addressing this crisis in our Church and lead us to push for the serious institutional reforms and to undertake the deep and abiding spiritual renewal that are needed. And throughout this process may we remain ever mindful of the victim-survivors and their love ones, and continue to pray for and assist them in achieving the healing, justice and reconciliation that they deserve as beloved daughters and sons of God.

#### What If...

I don't know about you, but sometimes there is a song or phrase playing in my head during the day. On good days it is a song from church. The words become a mantra helping me to focus.

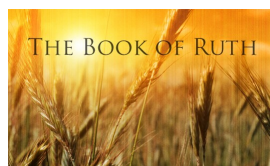
**What if** we earnestly beg the Lord to "Stay With Us", the Church, as we confront the issues of abuse and broken trust that weigh heavy on our hearts?
