## Meet our NCYC Chaperones

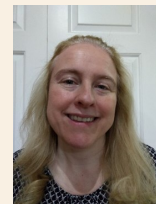
**Deanna Vincent**, Chaperone

Again, this year we will offer a reenactment of the Christmas story (pageant) before the start of the Christmas eve Mass at St. Boniface. The pageant, at 3:45, will precede the 4:00 PM Mass. We need all the "key players"—you know the story!, ADULTS who can help coordinate--this will include--checking on costumes, being present for 1 rehearsal, being available on Dec 24 for the Mass and repacking the costumes, etc... sometime the week after Christmas. ## ***A WORD FROM FR. JOHN...***

Inserted in our bulletin today is our Advent-Christmas flyer. We have attempted to capture in one place for you many of the events and activities happening in our parish as we are about to enter these significant and holy seasons. The hope is that we each will take a few moments over the next two weeks to review the opportunities presented and consider how we might use them to truly enter into the spirit of Advent. The first three weeks of December can fly by in a blur of activities and demands as we get ready for Christmas. I invite us all to consider how we might carve out and set aside some time to watch and wait in hopeful expectation of Christ coming into our lives.

One side of the flyer highlights various giving opportunities. In addition to the traditional gift giving and food donation options, we offer opportunities to give of your time and yourself in sending cards and/or delivering a poinsettia to our parishioners who are in nursing homes or homebound. The "Youth Corner" highlights two opportunities to come together for fun and service. Those who have delivered poinsettias in the past would probably share with you how even their short visit was more significant and meaningful for the person visited and for themselves. Where two or three gather in his name, Christ comes and his presence transforms the encounter.

On the other side of the flyer, we note various special events from the Young Adult Tree Trimming Party and Holiday Euchre Social, to the Alternative Christmas Fair, "Twelve Days of Christmas" Basket Raffle, Three Spirits Holiday Luncheon, and Children's Christmas Party with Santa. All of these create opportunities to gather with and encounter Christ in one another – simply by enjoying one another's presence.

This other side also highlights various religious and spiritual offerings. Our two Advent Penance Services will include our young children who will be celebrating their First Penance. By celebrating together with these children, we can give evidence that this sacrament is not a one-and-done event for the young, but something that we return to again and again along our faith journey. Hopefully, the witness of our children approaching the sacrament for the first time will be an encouragement and inspiration to all of us as well.

Building off of the positive feedback we received, we will again offer a Teaching Mass at one of regular Sunday liturgies. While we especially encourage families with children to attend, we all benefit from hearing again about what we do at Mass. As the source and summit of all we do as Church, any time spent growing in our knowledge and appreciation for the Eucharistic celebration is worth it.

A new offering for this year is "Be Still and Know that I am God." Amid the hustle and bustle, noise and sensory

overload that can fill the time between Thanksgiving and Christmas, we invite you to stop by one of our churches that will be open from 4:30-6:30pm for quiet prayer and reflection during the first three weeks of Advent. On Tuesday evenings, December 3, 10 and 17, St. Boniface will be open. On Wednesday evenings, December 4, 11 and 18, St. Mary's will be open. And on Thursday evenings, December 12 and 19, Blessed Sacrament will be open. On the first Thursday, December 5, following a wedding rehearsal, we will hold a musically enhanced Holy Hour at 6:00pm at Blessed Sacrament.

Our goal is to create a subdued, calm and quiet place to pray and reflect on Advent - the coming of Christ into our lives. We may choose to consider where we saw Christ in our life that day – the high point, the low point, and the closest moment to God. Faced with some challenge or tragedy in our life that may seem overwhelming or all-consuming, we might consider inviting Christ to come and transform it for us. When we consider that through the invocation of the Holy Spirit, ordinary bread and wine is transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ on the altar at Mass, what transformation that we seek could possibly be beyond our all-powerful, all-merciful and all-loving God. Or perhaps we feel drawn to consider how we can help others in need amid society's focus on giving and receiving gifts. For whatever reason, we may feel that we have nothing to give, nothing to share with others. But if we consider that Jesus sent his disciples out ordering them to take nothing with them, especially no material thing to share, then hopefully we come to realize that all that we have to share and all that we need is Christ in his words, in his deeds and in his love for others. How might we help those in need by pointing to and facilitating an awareness of Christ coming into their lives. These are only some suggestions of how we might use this quiet time for prayer and reflection. May we trust the Holy Spirit to inspire and guide us in the best use of this opportunity. And may our showing up lead to a greater awareness of Christ coming into our lives this Advent.

Lastly, the flyer lists various online resources to enhance your experience of Advent. We will include links to these sites on our parish website.

Once again, please take a few moments to consider how you might use the various opportunities highlighted on our flyer, as well as others that you may be aware of, to make the best use of this Advent time of Christ coming into our lives.

And please place the flyer where you can refer to it throughout the weeks ahead.

## RENEWING AND REFRESHING ADULT FAITH

### November: Month of All Saints

I have found myself drawn to saints who were down to earth, and who weren't afraid to express all their emotions to God, including their frustrations and anger. Saint Teresa of Ávila was like that. Once, upon having her cart turn over in the rain, she chastised the Lord, "If this is how you treat your friends it's no wonder you have so few!" Saint Teresa reminds me of another member of the Communion of Saints—my great-grandmother, an Irish woman who had no problem letting Jesus know when she wasn't happy with how things were going. She was devoted to her faith, kept photos of Jesus and Mary on the wall of her kitchen and talked to them often, as if they were dear friends. My saints are the friends and mentors who counsel and console me on my Christian journey. They are like me, flawed, but with a deep desire to abide in Christ. Our favorite saints may be different and appeal to us for different reasons, but they should each challenge us to respond to Pope Francis' questions: "How do I bear witness to the risen Christ? How do I abide in him? How do I remain in his love? Am I capable of 'sowing' in my family, in my workplace and in my community, the seed of that unity which he has bestowed on us by giving us a share in the life of the Trinity?" We are, after all, among the Communion of Saints.

### THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation are the sacraments of initiation. They begin and promote full membership in the Body of Christ, the Church. In Baptism, through the pouring of water or through immersion,

the individual enters into the mystery of Christ's death and resurrection and becomes "another Christ" and an adopted child of God. In eastern Catholic Churches an infant receives Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist (a drop of the Blood) at the same ceremony while in the west the three sacraments are generally celebrated at different times during the life of an individual. The Vatican recently approved a new rite of Baptism for children which will be implemented on the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on February 2, 2020 although our parishes are currently using the rite at baptisms during Mass. Next week's article will provide information on the various components of the rite of baptism of children during Mass.
