A WORD FROM FR. JOHN...

Please note that due to the printing schedule set by the publisher of our bulletin, I am writing this column on November 20, for submission to the printer on November 22.

As the note above indicates, I am writing to you about the First Sunday of Advent, the start of a new liturgical year, and I haven't yet celebrated the feast of Christ the King marking the end of the last year and the wonderful feast of Thanksgiving, which stands in between. It does seem a little disconcerting. Yet, it is not as disjointed as it may first appear. For the last several weeks of Ordinary Time called us to focus on the coming of Christ at the end of time, the end of world and the end of life, just as the first weeks of Advent call us to wait in joyful hope for the coming of Christ into our lives and into our hearts. It isn't until we draw closer to Christmas that the focus switches to the coming of Christ in the birth of Jesus.

Yet, Advent is a new season that marks an important shift in emphasis to a period marked especially by vigilance and waiting. The latter is particularly challenging for many of us as our culture conditions us to expect to get what we want when we want it without delay. We want an answer now, we google it. We want a product now, we order it from Amazon and select next day delivery. We want a particular meal, we turn to Grubhub, Uber Eats or DoorDash. Whatever we want, there seems to be an app for that.

Advent invites us to turn all of that on its head. If Advent were an app, it might be akin to hitting a pause button, being put on hold or sitting in a waiting room. While most of us probably dislike having to spend a great deal of time paused, on hold or stuck waiting, it can serve to heighten our focus and increase our longing. We just want it to be over

with, so that we can get on with what we anticipate is coming next. The more that time passes, the more acute our senses can become to any slight change, sound or motion that might signal that the wait is over. This is akin to the vigilance that Advent calls for.

A number of images come to mind in this regard: Sitting in the dark waiting for light to break in; Surrounded by quiet listening for an anticipated sound; Remaining still and calm yet ready to respond. With shorter days and cooler temperatures, nature stands ready to aid us in entering into the spirit of Advent. Yet, the hustle and bustle, noise and sensory overload, and seeming mad dash that often characterizes our lives especially between Thanksgiving and Christmas seem to work against it. We need not surrender ourselves entirely to the latter.

As I noted in this column two weeks ago, we are trying something new this year to aid us in entering into the spirit of Advent. In what we are calling "Be Still and Know that I am God," our goal is to create a subdued, calm and quiet place in each of our churches on successive evenings during the week to pray and reflect on Advent – the coming of Christ into our lives. The times and days are indicated in our Advent-Christmas flyer and in our weekly bulletin calendar on page 2. I hope that in taking advantage of this opportunity or creating something similar on your own, that the spirit of Advent comes alive in expectant waiting, hopeful anticipation, and joyful preparation for the coming of Christ.

TAX SAVING QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DEDUCTION

The 2018 changes to Federal income tax rules are a mixed blessing for New York Residents. However, one tax saving deduction that remained is the **Qualified Charitable Deduction (QCD)**. Tax payers 70 1/2 and older, who must make annual MRW withdrawals from IRA retirement accounts, can deduct amounts **made directly to charities (such as Blessed Sacrament, St. Boniface and St. Mary's)** decreasing taxable income. QCDs are subtracted from the taxable income on line 4a of the 1040. However, you cannot have such withdrawals sent to you and then forwarded to a charity. They must go directly to the charity from the IRA account. Contributions qualifying as QCDs can be made at any time during the tax year. This is not intended as tax advice. RENEWING AND REFRESHING ADULT FAITH

Wisdom from our parishioners:

"Best practices" for keeping Advent Holy.

May they encourage us to keep the season holy.

Many families use an **Advent calendar**:

"We have an Advent calendar, with doors opening to show Bible verses. It's a nice way to not only talk about the verses themselves, but also have the kids find the verse in the Bible."

"We will be acting on the suggestions as outlined on the Advent calendar provided by the USCCB" (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops).

Getting out **the creche** and arranging all the figures is a tradition in many families:

"First comes the stable, and then we unwrap each person and animal. I started with a traditional setting where the wise men are traveling from afar (far end of our sideboard) with the Holy Family inside and the shepherd and animals outside. But one day I noticed it had changed. The boys put all those not wearing shoes inside the stable. And a dog ornament too. I asked what happened, and I learned that they didn't want anyone without shoes to be outside. They are thinking it's snowing in Jerusalem like in Rochester. They were personalizing their experience: inviting those who may be cold inside and adding the dog because we have a dog too."

"We have a creche that we bless in anticipation of the Lord's coming. Each year we add to the creche scene, including origami animals."

"The creche is up through Advent and into Christmas. On Epiphany, we have a special German tradition where we ask the Wise Men to bless us and protect our house and the people within."

"Over these past few years, when alone and the house is silent, I sit in front of our little creche and just look at each figurine allowing my mind to ponder what it would have been like to be that person and be present to our Lord's birth. What was that shepherd, wise man, St. Joseph, Mary — what were their thoughts/feelings looking at this newborn baby with their knowledge and understanding that this little baby was our Lord?"

For other parishioners as well, **silence** is important in Advent:

"I propose spending some quiet time in reading scripture, spiritual readings, prayer and journaling. I have an Advent wreath set up and a candle scented with myrrh to aid my reflection in the silence."

"Take ten minutes of silence at the end of the day, silence not just from outside noise but also from your own thoughts, and listen for what God may have to say."

Other forms of **prayer** are central to Advent for our parishioners:

"We have a pile of mass cards/ prayer cards to pick to pray for a person we knew or a saint."

"This Advent I'm going to implement a practice of praying for one or two specific 'issues' both in my life and in the world."

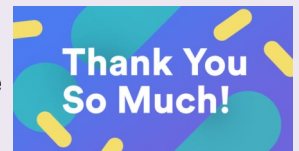
One or two adult volunteers would be very helpful as well, if possible.
