

AND THAT LIST CHANGES EACH DAY. EVEN A VISITING PRIEST MUST BE ONE OF THE THREE ON THAT LIST. SO, IF YOU'D LIKE MSGR. Due to the restrictions of the coronavirus pandemic, a public celebration of the annual Diocesan Wedding Anniversary Mass will not be held this year. Congratulatory certificates from Bishop McManus to couples celebrating significant wedding anniversaries in 2020 will be issued by postal mail. **Coming to Mass Now...**

We've had a safe re-opening Mass experience for the past **21 weeks**. We are regularly celebrating confessions, baptisms and other sacraments in addition to all our Masses. Persons who are ill should not come to Mass at this time. Family members may sit together in the same pew. With the exception of your own family members you must sit at least six feet apart from others. Social distancing is required. Every alternate pew is left empty. We've marked off those pews with tape. All people must wear a mask throughout the Mass with the **following exceptions...**(1) children under the age of 2 **should not wear** a mask; (2) parents will use their own discretion for those children between the age of 2 and 5 years old; (3) if a person has a medical or disabling condition they are not required to wear a mask.

**Let Your Voice Be Heard – Again!**

“*Say No to ROE*” The state legislature has extended the session until January 5, 2021. Please remind the members of the Joint Committee on Judiciary that you oppose the expansion of abortion in Massachusetts by calling 617-722-2396 and let them know you are **opposed** to H3320 and S1209 – the ROE legislation. Every telephone call helps! These bills would remove: 1) The requirement that young girls obtain consent before an abortion; 2) the requirement that efforts be made to save a living baby who survives abortion; 3) the requirement that late term abortions be performed in hospitals; and 4) the bills would allow abortion on demand for all nine months of pregnancy! **Events Not Happening this Fall**

As you likely already know from guidelines that the Commonwealth has established regarding **Houses of Worship**, all social gatherings (with the exception of those explicitly defined as worship ~ like Masses, sacraments, the Novena) are limited to twenty-five people (quite recently) in an enclosed space. Thus, there are several traditional events that are not taking place this fall. Examples are the Senior Luncheon, Italian Night, and the annual fall picnic. (The state's guidelines for schools, businesses, restaurants, supermarkets, etc. all vary from one institution to another.) There are other events not taking place here as well this fall. There are, for example, no scouting programs or A.A. meetings. We understand those programs are being conducted by ZOOM meetings. We look forward to the resumption of many activities when these guidelines are modified in some fashion. We are grateful that we can at least have a much higher number of people at our celebrations of Mass and the sacraments.
