Divine Mercy Reflections from St. Faustina's Dairy

The words with which I entreated God are these: **Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ for our sins and those of the whole world; for the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us** (*Diary*, 475).

The next morning, when I entered the chapel, I heard these words interiorly: **Every time you enter the chapel, immediately recite the prayer which I taught you yesterday** (*Diary*, 476).

In the Sign of the Cross we call upon God's name.

Calling upon God's name is a powerful biblical practice.

Psalms 54 says O God, by your name, save me. By your strength defend my cause. O God, hear my prayer, Listen to the words of my mouth.

Matthew 18:20 When two or three are gathered in my name I am in their midst.

John 14:13 Whatever you ask in my name I will do, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son.



The Sign of the Cross is a simple gesture yet a profound statement of our faith. It's something we do when we enter a church, after Communion, when we pray before meals, and every time we pray. But what exactly are we doing when we make the Sign of the Cross?

Here are 21 things: (cont. next week)

☉ **Pray.** We begin and end our prayers with the Sign of the Cross, perhaps not realizing that the sign is itself a prayer. If prayer, at its core, is "an uprising of the mind to God," then the Sign of the Cross assuredly qualifies. "No empty gesture, the sign of the cross is a potent prayer that engages the Holy Spirit as the divine advocate and agent of our successful Christian living,"

☉ **Open ourselves to grace.** As a sacramental, the Sign of the Cross prepares us for receiving God's blessing and disposes us to cooperate with His grace

☉ **Sanctify the day.** As an act repeated throughout the key moments of each day, the Sign of the Cross sanctifies our day. At every forward step and movement, when we put on our clothes and shoes, when we bathe, when we sit at table, when we light the lamps, on couch, on seat, in all the ordinary actions of daily life, we trace upon our forehead the sign

☉ **Witness to others.** As a gesture often made in public, the Sign of the Cross is a simple way to witness our faith to others.
