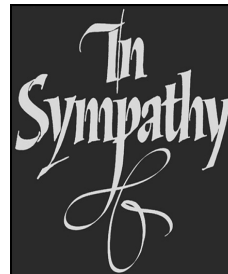

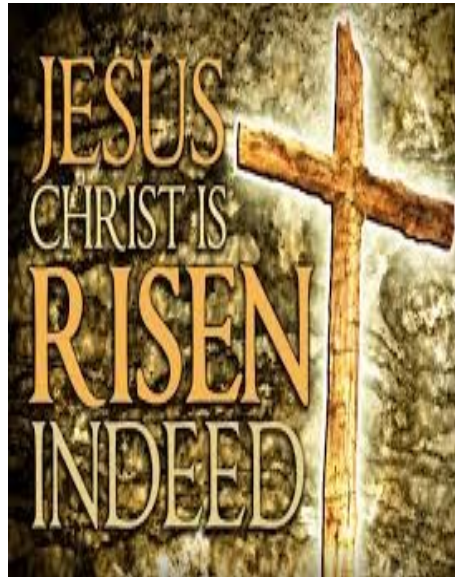

May is known as the "Month of Mary"**

Mary, the Mother of God and first and best disciple of Jesus, holds a special place in Catholic hearts and homes. She teaches us faith, humility, and love for God and others. We look to her as our model and heavenly mother, and have many ways to show our devotion:

- 1) Display Mary's image (picture or statue) in a place of honor and set flowers and candles near it.
- 2) Make a Mary Candle (a large white candle marked with an "M" and decorated with a blue ribbon.)
- 3) Set up a May altar using a pretty blue cloth, a candle and fresh flowers. Crown your statue of Mary and sing a Marian hymn.
- 4) Create a Mary garden outside. A Mary garden consists of a statue of Mary and some flowers—any color and any amount.

Divine Mercy Reflections from St. Faustina's Diary
