The Jubilee Museum

The Jubilee Museum has been recognized by the Vatican as the largest collection of diversified Catholic art in the U.S. Established in 1998 by Fr. Kevin Lutz, its purpose is to preserve the Catholic mind and memory as it is represented in art. The museum embraces art that tells the story of Christ, Mary, the saints, and the history of the Catholic Church.

Currently their featured exhibit is **The Lego Vatican**. Artist Fr. Simon has been a Roman Catholic priest for 27 years. Setup of the model takes up to two days, with three people working on the structure's 25 different sections. The Piazza has over 44,000 cobblestones sitting atop 12,000 tan tiles. There are over 6,000 round bricks that make up the columns of the Colonnade. The model is worth \$10,000 in LEGO® bricks and took over 10 months to build.
