

**Visiting Missionary  
Next Weekend, August 18 & 19**

Fr. Cherian Pulikunnel, a missionary priest from India will be here to participate in our Annual Missionary Cooperation Plan. He will preach at both Masses and will make an appeal for the Vincentian Missions.

**Why do we ring the bells during the Eucharistic Prayer?**

The bells originally had a practical purpose. The Mass was in Latin, and the words were spoken quietly by the priest – so even if microphones had been invented it still wouldn't have carried the priest's words.

The bells were also rung so that large congregations where everyone might not be able to see the priest could know the most important part of the Mass was taking place.

The bells were rung one time when the priest extended his hands over the chalice in blessing right before the Consecration. This was a signal to the congregation that the Consecration was about to take place. Then, when the words of Consecration had been spoken, the priest would genuflect, raise the Host (Chalice) to be visible to the people, and then genuflect again.

The bell was rung at each of those steps – so the triple ring became common.

He said the Bible is a little strange and puzzling and we need a good guide to move us through that world. Christ speaks to us through the Old and New Testaments and the homily serves as our guide.

Bishop Barron said that one problem with Catholic teaching is that we tend to run from the Bible. The preacher is to explore with us the biblical world and interpret it into today's world. For example, in one of the Gospels we hear of Jesus talking to the Samaritan woman at the well. The Homily can show that every person in the congregation is that woman at the well. The Homilist draws a correlation between our questions and answers. The Gospel has the answers.

The Homily isn't a vacation/a break in the middle of the Mass but a time to see how we fit into the readings.
