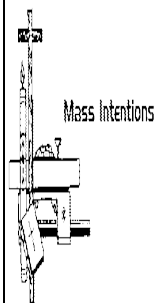

**Sign-up Sheets** are in the back of the churches.

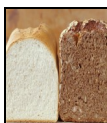

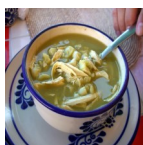

## October is the Month of the Rosary

What does the word "Rosary" mean? Rosary means a crown of roses, a spiritual bouquet given to the Blessed Mother.

A quote on the Rosary: When you say your Rosary, the angels rejoice, the Blessed Trinity delights in it, my Son finds joy in it too, and I myself am happier than you can possibly guess. After the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, there is nothing that I love as much as the Rosary.

## History of the Rosary

The rosary probably began as a practice by the laity to imitate the monastic Divine Office during the course of which the monks daily prayed the 150 Psalms. The laity, many of whom could not read, substituted 50 or 150, Ave Marias (Hail Marys) for the Psalms. Sometimes a cord with knots on it was used to keep an accurate account of the Aves.

The first clear historical reference to the rosary is from the life of St. Dominic who died in 1221. He preached a form of the rosary in France at the time that the Albigensian heresy was devastating the Faith there. Tradition has it that the Blessed Mother herself asked for the practice as an antidote for heresy and sin.
