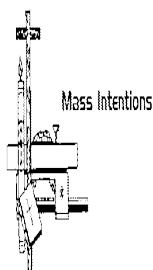
## PRAYER FOR OUR MILITARY

## The Holy Rosary

The rosary is one of the most cherished prayers of our Catholic Church.

Over the centuries the saints and popes have highly recommended the rosary, saying it's the greatest prayer after the Mass and Liturgy of the Hours.

During its recitation, the individual meditates on the saving mysteries of our Lord's life and the faithful witness of our Blessed Mother.

The rosary probably began as a practice by the laity to imitate the Divine Office (Liturgy of the Hours), in which the monks daily prayed the 150 Psalms.

Many people couldn't read so they substituted 50 or even 150 Hail Mary's for the Psalms. Sometimes a cord with knots on it was used to keep an accurate count of the Aves.

The Rosary seems to date from as early as the 2nd century, as ancient graffiti at Christian sites has suggested.
