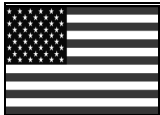

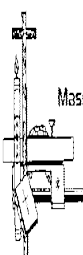


PRAYER FOR OUR MILITARY

Divine Mercy Reflections from St. Faustina's Diary

Jesus: *My child, make the resolution never to rely on people. Entrust yourself completely to My will saying, "Not as I want, but according to Your will, O God, let it be done unto me."*

These words, spoken from the depths of one's heart, can raise a soul to the summit of sanctity in a short time.

In such a soul I delight. Such a soul gives Me glory. Such a soul fills heaven with the fragrance of their virtue. But understand that the strength by which you bear sufferings comes from frequent Communion. So approach this fountain of mercy often, to draw with the vessel of trust whatever you need (*Diary*, 1487).

St. Patrick was a fifth century Christian missionary and bishop in Ireland. Known as the "Apostle of Ireland" he is the primary patron saint of Ireland. The dates of Patrick's life cannot be fixed with certainty, but there is broad agreement that he was active as a missionary in Ireland during the fifth century.

Early medieval tradition credits him with being the first bishop of Ireland and they regard him as the founder of Christianity in Ireland, converting a society practicing a form of Celtic polytheism. According to Patrick's autobiographical account, when he was about sixteen years old, he was captured by Irish pirates from his home in Britain and taken as a slave to Ireland. By his account he lived there for six years before escaping and returning to his family Britain where he became a cleric. Patrick eventually returned to Ireland, where in later life, he became a bishop.

Saint Patrick's Day is observed on March 17, the supposed date of his death. It is celebrated inside and outside Ireland as a religious and cultural holiday. In Ireland it is a holy day of obligation. It is also a celebration of Ireland itself. Read more about St. Patrick at www.catholic.org
