What is a Novena?

A Novena is an ancient devotion that consists of 9 days of prayer. Novenas are often prayed in preparation for a feast day or for a specific intention.

At www.praymorenovenas.com

you can sign up for novena reminders, they will send the right prayers to your inbox each day so you don't miss praying! Hundreds of thousands of people have benefited from these reminders. Joining will help you feel the power of praying (about one novena a month) with people around the world!

To celebrate Pentecost, the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Church, the Holy Spirit Novena began on May 31 but you can start anytime. It is a powerful and moving novena that is meant to help us open ourselves up to the third person of the Holy Trinity.

Even though we pray this novena as a preparation for the feast of Pentecost, you can also pray a novena to the Holy Spirit any time that you want. So, let us pray with great confidence and trust in our God who is all Good and Loving.



The Ascension of Our Lord, which occurred 40 days after Jesus Christ rose from the dead on Easter, is the final act of our redemption that Christ began on Good Friday. On this day, the risen Christ, in the sight of His apostles, ascended bodily into Heaven.

(Luke 24:51, Mark 16:19,
Acts 1:9-11)

Grant, we beseech Thee, almighty God, that we who believe Thine only-begotten Son, our Redeemer, to have this day ascended into heaven, may dwell in spirit amid heavenly things. Through the same Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end. Amen.

When you buy flowers for your home you might want to place a simple bud vase before your statue of Mary as a thank you for her many intercessions for you and your loved ones.

It is also a little gesture or token of your affection for her. Flowers before her image, can remind you of her love for you and that love brings much beauty and hope to your life.

History of the Ascension

The observance of this feast is of great antiquity. Eusebius seems to hint at the celebration of it in the 4th century. At the beginning of the 5th century, St. Augustine says that it is of Apostolic origin, and he speaks of it in a way that shows it was the universal observance of the Church long before his time.

The *Pilgrimage of Aetheria* speaks of the vigil of this feast and of the feast itself, as they were kept in the church built over the grotto in Bethlehem in which Christ was born.

Some historians believe that in the early church the Ascension was celebrated along with Pentecost. Representations of the mystery are found in frescoes dating as early as the 5th century.

Most Christian faiths celebrate the Feast of the Ascension.
