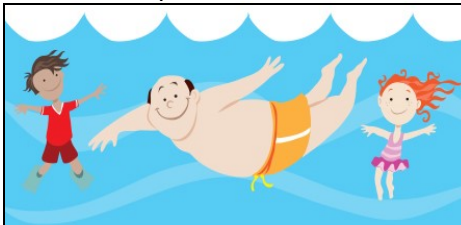

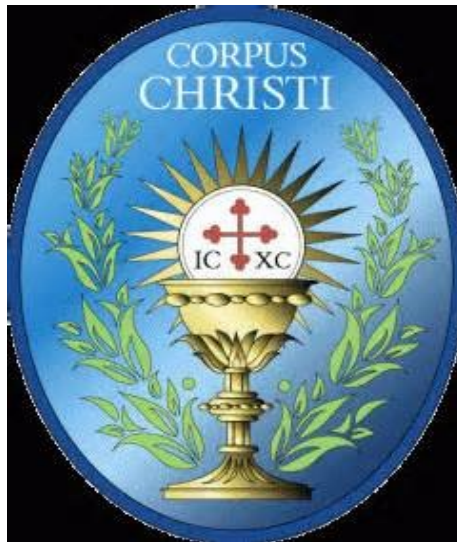
EWTN was founded by Mother Angelica in 1981 and today is the largest media network in the world. In 1999 the Shrine and Monastery were dedicated in Hanceville, AL, about 60 miles from EWTN.

A pilgrimage to the Shrine of the Most Blessed Sacrament provides a place for prayer and quiet contemplation - pilgrims may attend Holy Mass, silently join the Nuns as they pray the Liturgy of the Hours throughout the day and spend time in private Adoration. The Shrine is notable for its gilt interior, solemn atmosphere, and 7.5 ft. monstrance.

**The Feast of Corpus Christi,
or the
Feast of the Body
and Blood of Christ**

(as it is often called today), goes back to the 13th century, but it celebrates something far older: the institution of the Sacrament of Holy communion at the Last Supper. While Holy Thursday is also a celebration of this mystery, the solemn nature of Holy Week and the focus on Christ's Passion on Good Friday, overshadows that aspect of Holy Thursday.

Corpus Christi is Latin for Body of Christ.

The feast of Corpus Christi owes a large debt to St. Juliana, a nun of Liege, Belgium, who was led to start a celebration of the Mass around AD 1230. At an early age, she developed a strong devotion to the Blessed Sacrament, and she longed for a feast in honor of the Eucharist. In AD 1264 Pope Urban IV instituted the observance of the feast.

St. Thomas Aquinas is given credit for many of the customs and hymns associated with Corpus Christi.

The Feast of Corpus Christi is celebrated throughout the Catholic Church.

Corpus Christi is included in the calendar of a few Anglican churches most notably the Church of England. It was retained in the Lutheran Church's calendar until about 1600.

The Corpus Christi procession is not a walking to the Lord, to the Eucharistic celebration; it is a walking *with* the Lord; it is itself an element of the Eucharistic celebration, one dimension of the Eucharistic event. The Lord who has become our bread is thus showing us the way, He leads us.
