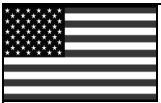

What Makes the Cathedral a Basilica?

Traditionally, churches attained the title of basilica because of their antiquity, dignity, historical importance, or significance as centers of worship.

There are Two Classes of Basilicas: Major and Minor. There are only four major basilicas in the world, all in Rome. There are about 80 minor Basilicas in the United States.

The construction of the Cathedral of St. Peter in Chains began in 1841 and was completed in 1845.

The Bells: The hour bell cast by Hanks in 1851 remains, and was rededicated along with a new set of 12 dutch bells on February 24, 1957 cast by the Petit Bellfoundry of the Netherlands. In 2010 the tower bells were completely refurbished.

The Mosaic: The Venetian glass mosaic which fills the rear wall of the sanctuary is the largest such work in the United States, 35 feet high and about 40 feet wide.

**Why do Catholics Make a Sign of
the Cross before the Gospel?**

During the encounter with the Word of God we make a small cross with our thumb on our forehead, lips and over our hearts to ask God to help His Word to dwell in our minds, on our lips, and in our heart.

Once the priest finishes the Gospel reading he'll kiss the Gospel again to show reverence and respect for the very Words of God, and then begin his homily. We sit during the homily to listen and learn.
