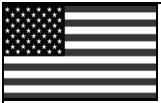

### April's Women of the Church Study was on Dolores Hope

Dolores was known as an entertainer, the widow of comedian Bob Hope, and as the benefactor of many charitable causes. She was "a Catholic of deep and abiding faith". She and Bob adopted four children.

Dolores had a chapel in her home where she frequently asked friends to gather for retreat. Dolores was close to many clergy, including priests, nuns, bishops and cardinals. She eventually influenced her husband to convert to Catholicism.

Dolores and Bob donated to many charities. Even today, a grant built on the Bob Hope Military Emergency Assistance Fund is serving military families impacted by global COVID 19 pandemic.

Dolores was the recipient of numerous secular and religious awards and honors. She is one of four women in the world to have been presented the Dame of St. Gregory the Great papal honor from Pope John Paul II. Dolores lived to be 102, passing in 2011

## Corpus Christi Sunday

'Corpus Christi' is a Latin phrase that refers to the body of Christ.

Corpus Christi, the Feast of the Sacred Body and Blood of Jesus which is given to us in the Most Holy Eucharist, is a profound, prophetic and powerful Feast in the Catholic Church. Though this Feast has been transferred to Sunday in the United States, the Church in much of the world celebrates it on Thursday. Whenever it is celebrated, it is meant to be a richly significant day in Catholic Christian life.

On this day we are reminded that Jesus Christ still gives Himself to us, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. He comes to live within us, and we live in Him through our Baptism into His Body, the Church.

There is also an ancient and beautiful custom in the Latin Rite of the Catholic Church called the Corpus Christi procession. The consecrated Host, the Body of the Lord, is reposed in the monstrance. The faithful process the Body of the Lord through the streets surrounding their church buildings.

This Eucharistic procession can be a powerful witness to an age which has lost its sense of the sacred. We proclaim by our action that the Lord is truly present, giving Himself to all who call upon him. The faithful process out of the Church building and go into the street, singing songs of worship. Jesus Christ is not dead, He is alive. He has been raised from the dead. He still walks through our streets as truly as He walked the streets of Galilee.

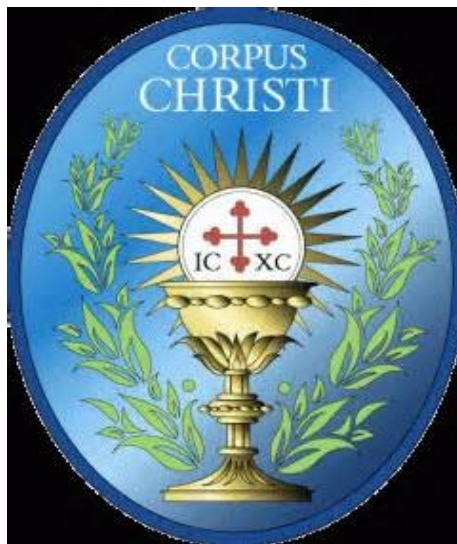
### The Founder of the Feast.

### The Feast of Corpus Christi Procession June 14, this Sunday, immediately after Mass

The Corpus Christi procession is not a walking to the Lord, to the Eucharistic celebration; it is a walking with the Lord; it is itself an element of the Eucharistic celebration, one dimension of the Eucharistic event. The Lord who has become our bread is thus showing us the way, He leads us.

The canopy serves a dual purpose. It protects the Blessed Sacrament during the procession. It provides a "sacred space" that is reserved for the monstrance.

It also protects the monstrance against anything that might fall on it, including light rain.

Secondarily, the faithful at the back of the procession can locate the Blessed Sacrament at the head of the procession more easily.

The procession is a visible sign of our faith. **Please plan to attend.**
